THE Pacification of Germany seems now to be drawing to a very speedy Conclusion, the Town of Teschen in Austrian Silesia being fixed upon for the Place of Meeting of the several Plenipotentiaries, who are expected to arrive there on the 10th of March; on which Day it is thought the Suspension of Hostilities will be declared. Count Cobenzel will be appointed the Plenipotentiary of this Court. Orders have been already dispatched from hence to stop the March of the Recruits towards the different Armies of this Monarchy.

St. James's, February 2, 1779

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that, about Six o'Clock in the Morning of the 2d of last Month, a dreadful Fire broke out in the Royal Hospital for Seamen at Greenwich, which extended itself with such Rapidity and roged with such Violence, that, before the same could be extinguished, the Chapel and Cupola, with several of the Wards in Queen Mary's Building, were destroyed, and other considerable Damage done; and whereas it has been further represented to His Majesty, that, notwithstanding the most diligent Enquiries, it hath not yet appeared whether the said Fire was the Effect of Accident, or wilfully and maliciously occasioned by some Evil-disposed Person or Persons at present unknown: His Majesty, therefore, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice any Person or Persons who may have been concerned in wilfully and maliciously setting Fire to the said Hospital, as above-mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One of the said Offenders (except the Person or Persons who actually set Fire to the said Hospital) who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices in the said Offence, so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended and duly convicted thereof.

And, as a farther Encouragement for bringing to Punishment the Person or Persons who may have been concerned in the above mentioned atrocious Offence, the Commissioners and Governors of the said Hospital do hereby

hereby promise a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be paid without any Deduction whatsoever, by the Treasurer of the said Hospital, to any Person or Persons who shall discover the Offender or Offenders, so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended and convicted as aforesaid.

General Post-Office, January 19, 1779.

ON Saturday last the 16th Instant, about Six o'Clock in the Evening, the Post-Boy was attacked and robbed, at a Place called Priest's Bridge, about Four Miles North of Morpeth, of the whole Scotch Mail, and the Bags from Berwick, Belford, and Alnwick, which should have arrived here this Morning, by Two Footpads, armed with Bludgcon, who stopped the Boy, cut the Mails from the Cart, and immediately conveyed the same into a Wood adjoining, of whom no

further Description can be given from the Darkness of the Night.

Whosoever shall apprehend and convict, or cause to be apprehended and convicted, both or either of the Persons who committed this Robbery, will be intitled to a Reward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, over and above the Reward given by Act of Parliament for apprehending Highwaymen: Or if any Person, whether an Accomplice in the said Robbery, or knowing thereof, shall make Discovery, whereby both or either of the Persons who committed the same may be apprehended and brought to Justice; such Discoverer will, upon Conviction of both or either of the Parties be intitled to the same Reward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, and will also receive His Majesty's most gracious Pardon.

THE Post Boy, carrying the Mail which was dispatched from this Office last Friday Night, was robbed by two Footpads with Crapes over their Faces, on Saturday Night at Ten o'Clock, at the Bottom of Hack Lane near Long Compton, between Euxton and Shipstone in Oxfordshire, of the whole Mail, containing the following Bags, viz. Warwick, Stratford on Avon, Shipston on Stour, Ledbury, Hereford, Bromsgrove, Worcester, Stone, Newcastle under Line, Macclesfield, Middlewich, Hoims Chaple, Knutsford, Manchester, Stockport, Liverpool, Warington, Wigan, Preston, Blackburn, Lancaster, Kendal, Wolverhampton, Shrewsbury, Bridgnorth, Stafford, Chiffnal, Namptwich, Chelster, Northop, Conway, St. Athaph, Bangor, Holyhead, and the Irish Mail.

The Persons, who committed this Robbery were small sized Men; but it being a dark foggy Night, the Boy cannot give any further Description of them.

Whoever shall apprehend and convict, or cause to be apprehended and convicted, both or either of the Persons who committed this Robbery, will be intitled to a Reward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, over and above the Reward given by Act of Parliament for apprehending Highwaymen: Or, if any Person, whether an Accomplice in the said Robbery, or knowing thereof, shall make Discovery whereby both or either of the Persons who committed the same may be apprehended and brought to Justice, such Discoverer will, upon Conviction of both or either of the Parties, be intitled to the same Reward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, and will also receive His Majesty's most Gracious Pardon.
