THIS is to give Notice, That His Royal Highness the young Prince is to be Christened in the Great Council Chamber at St. James's Palace, on Tuesday next the 23d Instant, about Seven o'Clock in the Evening; and that all Peers and Peereffes, Privy Counsellors and their Wives, Foreign Ministers and their Wives, who purpose to attend at the Ceremony, are to assemble in the Queen's Presence-Chamber and Drawing-Room in the said Palace, between the Hours of Six and Seven in the Evening.

HIS Majesty having been pleased to appoint George Earl of Winchilsea and Nottingham to be Lord Lieutenant of the County of Rutland; his Lordship this Day took the Oaths appointed to be taken thereupon, instead of the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy.

Stockholm, March 2. We still continue to have the most extraordinary mild and open Season that was ever known in this Country, insomuch that the Passage to the Sea is navigable; and some Ships, that have wintered here, intend to sail in the Course of the Week; and we are expecting the Arrival of others from Abroad.

Vienna, March 3. The Nobility and Foreign Ministers had the Honour of paying their Court, this Morning, to the Grand Duke and Grand Dutchess of Tuscany, who are to set out on the 8th Instant.

Dresden, March 7. An Account is just received here, that on the 28th of last Month, early in the Morning, the City of Neustadt in Upper Silesia had been attacked by a Detachment of Austrians, composed of Fifteen Battalions of Infantry, and Three Regiments of Cavalry, under the Command of General Stein, and summoned to surrender, and on the Prussian Commandant, Colonel Winterfield's Refusal, the Enemy cannonaded the Town, which was set on Fire by the Bombs. The Garrison consisted of the Hereditary Prince of Prussia's Regiment, which retreated towards the Prussian Troops posted in that Neighbourhood.

Hague, March 9. Yesterday, being the Anniversary of the Birthday of the Prince Stadtholder, who entered in the 32d Year of his Age, his Serene Highness received the Compliments of the Ministers of State and other Persons of Distinction upon the Occasion.
