Admiralty-Office, March 23, 1779.

CAPTAIN Fielding, of His Majesty's Ship the Sultan, arrived Yesterday at Spithead, with the Pearl Frigate, from St. Lucie, but left from Antigua, which Place he left the 16th of February, with Dispatches from Vice Admiral Byron and Rear Admiral Barrington to Mr. Stephens, and also Dispatches from Major General Grant to Lord George Germain, containing the Particulars of the Reduction of St. Lucie, and giving an Account that M. D'Estaing, with his whole Fleet, had taken Refuge in the Harbour of Port Royal in Martinico, and that Vice Admiral Byron had made a Disposition of his Fleet, to prevent his Escape.

These Dispatches are too long to be inserted in this Night's Gazette, but will be published in an Extraordinary Gazette Tomorrow.

Dresden, March 10. This Day his Royal Highness Prince Henry of Prussia published, by Order of his Prussian Majesty, a general Suspension of Arms; and the same was signified to the Austrian Generals on this Side.

All the Plenipotentiaries are expected to arrive at Teschen this Day, and the Conferences are to open on the 12th Instant.

Berlin, March 13. Letters received last Night from Breslau mention the Departure of the following Persons, named by their respective Courts, to assist at the Congress at Teschen. Prince Repnin; Baron Riedesel, formerly Prussian Envoy at Vienna; Count Zinzendorff, Saxon Minister at the Court of Berlin; Monf. de Hofensels, Minister of Deux-Ponts; and Count Toerring-Seefeld, lately appointed the Elector Palatine's Envoy to his Prussian Majesty. They were to be met, on the 10th Instant, by Baron de Breteuil and Count Cobenzel; and it was expected the Conferences would be opened as Yesterday the 12th Instant.

A Suspension of Arms has been published, to take Place in Upper Silesia on the 6th, in Lower Silesia the 7th, in Saxony the 10th, and to continue till the 1st of May.
