will be compleated in three weeks time, to 36000 effective, that his Highness hath sent away all his worst Troops, and hath drawn out others from the Garisons in their places. The Most Christian King is at Conde, and his Army will be drawn together the 17 instant, at two feveral Rendevous, the one at Keurain, the other at Eram near Oudenard. Our Italian Letters tell us that the French Convoy from Messina passed by Genoua, confifting of 50 Sail, of which, ten Men of War, and that they carried with them a very confiderable supply both of Provisions and Troops; that ten Gallies are flill behind at Thoulon, who are to follow very suddenly. They write also that some French Gallies from Messina had the good fortune to meet with fix Spanish Gallies in their way from Naples to Sicily, with whom they fought, and took three of the Spanish Gallies; the other faved themselves upon the Coast of Italy, being much shattered. Letters from Sicily fay, that the Marquis Caftel Redrigo was ready to take the Field with an Army of 3000 Horse, and 5000 Foot, and that the French were already in the Field, and had taken two Castles towards Citania, which they have razed. We hear that the Prince of Orange's Army marches this day from Eckelo to Lacrum, a great Village in the County of Dendermonde, at his Excellencies desire, all the Country about their former quarters being eaten up.

Haque, May 14. The 12 inftant, in the evening, his Highmels the Prince of Orange arrived very unexpededly at Honflaer-dyle, where he was met by the Pentionary Fagel; the lait night his Highnels lodged at Sorgboliet, and, as we understand, is this day returned to the Army, which is going to change quarters, the better to observe the Enemies motions. From Nimeguen they tell us, that the Baggage, with several Servants of the Marquis de os Balbaces, the chief of the Ambassadors of Spain was arrived there, and that his Excellency was himself expected there in sew days. It is said that the Most Christian King has proposed a Truce for a certain number of years, but that the Confederates do not like it. We have here this following List of the Emperors soccess.

Paris, May 15. On Monday night last the Kings Lieutenant at Trimoville, and the Major at Verdun, after having been feveral days in Arreft, were fent priloners to the Baffile, being failpected, as is faid, to have held intelligence with the Enemy. The 18 or 19 inflant the King will hold a general Rendezvous of his Forces in Flanders, which we are told he will afterward of his Forces in Flanders, which we are tout the mind divide into three Bodies, and that the Mareschal de Schomberg shall command one between the Sambre and the Menfe. news at Court at prefent is, that his Majefty will be suddenly here, but the precise time is not said. All the Officers that were here are gone to the Army, and as we are informed the Marescal de Lo ge has received orders to be at Conde before the end of this mon h. Our Lettees from Luxeming and those parts tellus, that the Duke of Lorraine was with the Troops under his command not far from Stein, and that he did amake great quantities of Provisions. Yesterday we received advice of the action that had happened on the 3d of March between the Kings thips, under the command of the Count d'Eftrees, and the Dutch, commanded by the Sieur Binches at Tobago in the West lindies the latter had posted themselves in the Road with all advantage, and had planted 30 pieces of Cannon on the shore, being in all 14 Men of War great and small. Our ships were ten in number, and the Council Estres having held a Councel of War, it was resolved at the same time to attack the ships in the Road, and the Fort on the shore; which was accordingly executed, the Forces necessary having to that purpose been landed; all matters having been concerted, our ships entred the Road, where the Dutch lay at Anchor, and about feven in the morning the Fight began, which continued till five in the evening, with great oblinacy, when there remained no more of the Enemies ships, 11 of them having been burnt and sunk, and three forced afflore. On our fide four flips were likewice loft, two accidentally burnt, and two funk, and of the former was the Count a'Estress own ship, called the Glorieux, of which most of the men were lost, the Count saving himfels with three or four Officers more in a small Boat. The attempt which was made at the same time upon the Fort did not sucgeed. By our next wo may be able to tell you the farther par-ticulars. The Sieur Courtin, his Majestics Ambassador in tragland, having defired the Kings leave to return home, his Maz jefty has granted it, and has appointed the Sieur Barillon to fucceed him in that employment
