

Tools so seized shall, after Condemnation, be publicly sold to the best Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall seize and secure the same.

If the Captain of any Vessel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the said Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Vessel, he shall, for every such Offence, forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Persons exporting the Tools; and if the Vessel belongs to His Majesty, the Captain shall not only forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, but shall also forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majesty.

If any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly suffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or sign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the said Tools, or knowingly suffer the same to be done, he shall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforesaid, and also forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majesty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the same.

*Hague, June 4.* This being the Anniversary of the King of Great Britain's Birth-day, Sir Joseph Yorke, His Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary to the States General, received the Compliments of the Foreign Ministers, Nobility, and Members of the Government. His Excellency gives a Ball and Supper this Evening upon the Occasion, at which their Serene and Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Orange, and Prince Lewis of Brunswick, will be present, with a very numerous and splendid Company of both Sexes.

*Petersburg, May 11.* Her Imperial Highness was on Saturday last, the 8th Instant, happily delivered of a Prince at Czarso Zelo; the next Day, the Nobility and Foreign Ministers went thither to congratulate her Imperial Majesty on the Occasion. The new-born Duke is to be baptized on Sunday next by the Name of Constantine.

*Dresden, May 16.* His Royal Highness Prince Henry of Prussia is still here; but the different Divisions of the Prussian Army will all be in Motion Tomorrow, and in a few Days will have entirely evacuated this Electorate. The Courier from his Prussian Majesty with these Orders arrived here on Friday Night; and they will be the more readily executed, as every Preparation had been made for this Purpose. The greatest Part of the Prussian Artillery is likewise embarked on the Elbe, and many of the Vessels are gone for Magdeburg, to which Place the Whole (except the Field-Pieces of the different Regiments) is to be conveyed.

*Dresden, May 23.* Different Regiments of the Prussian Army have past through this Place every Day this Week. When all the Troops which were quartered on the Side of Bohemia have past Dresden, it is thought Prince Henry of Prussia will set out for Berlin, and deliver up the Command of the different Columns of the Army to those Generals who are to march them to their several Places of Destination; the Prince's Departure is therefore expected to take Place the 27th or 28th Instant.

*Vienna, May 26.* His Imperial Majesty has nominated Count Philip Cobenzel to the Employment of Vice-Chancellor de Cour et d'Etat.

We see every Day some Austrian Regiments on their March to their established Quarters, and the Reduction of the Free Corps will be carried into Execution immediately.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.  
W H E R E A S the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 17th of February last, for prohibiting the Exporting out of

this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwise, Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire on the 23d of this instant May: And whereas it is judged expedient that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, except in those Cases where (for the Benefit and Advantage of Trade, and for the Use and Defence of Ships trading to Foreign Parts, and of the Transports and Victualling Vessels employed in His Majesty's Service) His Majesty, by His several Orders in Council of the 13th and 27th of October, and of the 6th and 22d of November, 1775, of the 5th and 19th of February, and the 23d of August and 25th of September, 1776, and the 16th of April, the 13th of August, and the 3d and 10th of October, 1777, of the 19th of June, the 7th and 26th of August, and the 10th of September last, has thought proper to permit and allow the Exportation of, and carrying Coastwise, Gunpowder, Saltpetre, Arms and Ammunition, under certain Conditions and Restrictions mentioned in the said Orders: His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever (except the Master-General, Lieutenant-General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance, for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Three Months, to commence from the said 23d Day of this instant May, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwise, any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwise, except in the Cases comprized within the aforementioned Orders in Council, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and suffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the 29th Year of His late Majesty's Reign, entituled, "An Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Saltpetre, and to enforce the Law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms and Ammunition; and also to empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwise of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition."—And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
