Whereas, by an Act of Parliament passed the 3d Day of this Month, intituled, "An Act for augmenting the Militia," it is enacted, that, from and after the passing thereof, if any Person or Persons, properly qualified according to the Laws now in Force, shall offer to His Majesty's Lieutenant of any County to raise one or more Company or Companies to be added to the Regiment or Battalion of any County or Riding, it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty's Lieutenant to accept such Offers, and appoint Officers accordingly:

In Pursuance, therefore, of the said Act of Parliament, any Person or Persons properly qualified, and desirous of raising one or more Company or Companies, to be added to the Battalion of Militia for the County of Monmouth, are desired to give Notice to His Majesty's Lieutenant of the said County.

And whereas it may be expedient to appoint a General Meeting of the said County of Monmouth, in order to consult what Measures may be proper to be taken for the Service of the Publick, in the very critical Situation of this Country; I do hereby appoint a General Meeting to be held at the King's Head in the Town of Monmouth, at Twelve o'Clock in the Forenoon, on the 6th Day of August; and I do earnestly request the No-
