**T**HE following Address of the Bailiffs and Burgeses of the Borough of Scarborough, having been transmitted by his Grace the Duke of Rutland to the Lord Viscount Weymouth, One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has been presented to His Majesty: Which Address His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

**W**E, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Bailiffs and Burgeses of the Borough of Scarborough in the County of York, truly sensible of the invaluable Blessings we enjoy under the Excellence of the British Constitution, and full of Gratitude for the anxious Care shewn by your Majesty, and your illustrious Ancestors of the House of Brunswick, for its Preservation, beg Leave to approach your Throne at this critical Juncture of national Danger, to declare our firm and unalterable Attachment to your Royal Person and Government; and to assure your Majesty, that every Ability and Influence in our Power, both in our separate and corporate Capacity, shall be zealously exerted in the Defence of the one, and the Support of the other; and confident that the Threats and Preparations of the united inveterate Enemies of this Kingdom will excite in your Majesty's Subjects a Spirit sufficient to repel any hostile Attack, we hope, and ardently pray, that the Supreme Disposer of Events will, in Justice to your Cause, restore that Peace to all your Majesty's Dominions, which we sincerely believe is, and has ever been, your Majesty's constant Endeavour to preserve.

Given under our Common Seal the Fourteenth Day of August, in the Year of our Lord, One thousand seven hundred and seventy-nine.

*Petersburgh, August 3.* Yesterday, being the Birth-day of her Imperial Highness the Great Dutchess, there was a grand Ball and magnificent Illuminations at Peterhoff; and To-morrow the Court removes from thence to Czarso-Zelo.

*Vienna, August 14.* The Nobility and Foreign Ministers had the Honour of paying their Court Yesterday to their Imperial Majesties at Schonbrun, for the last Time before the Emperor's Departure for Bohemia. These Drawing-Rooms will be discontinued at Court until his Imperial Majesty's Return.

Wesell-hill before-mentioned, whoever therefore shall harbour or conceal him after this Notice will be prosecuted with the utmost Rigour of the Law.
