York Building Company's Creditors.

IN the Process of Ranking of the Creditors of the York Building Company, pending in the Court of Session, the Lord Mordant Ordinary, upon the Application of certain Creditors who were not ready to exhibit their Grounds of Debt, has pronounced the following Interlocutor:
