*Pera of Constantinople, September 3.*

**O**N the 18th of last Month the Tartar Deputies (Five in Number) arrived by Sea from Crimea and were conducted to a House prepared for them at a Village called Beicos, situated on the Canal. The President of the Council was sent the next Day to compliment them on their Arrival. On the 28th the Deputies, attended by the Officer who superintends their Household, waited on the Vizir's Lieutenant, and afterwards on the Master of the Ceremonies; and were then conducted to the Publick Audience of the Vizir, to whom they delivered their Credentials, and the Letters of Notification from Shahin Ghirai, Kan of the Tartars, with a National Declaration signed by the Chiefs of each Tribe, certifying that he was duly elected. The principal Deputy was placed on a Carpet spread at the Foot of the Sopha, on which the Vizir is seated, and the other Deputies on the Mats which cover the Floor; and were treated with Coffee and Sherbet. They were afterwards introduced to the Musti, and then to the Reis Effendi. On the 29th Suleiman Effendi, Chief of the Pursuivants, was appointed to carry to Shahin Ghirai Kan the Sabre, and Turban adorned with an Egrette; which is the ancient Form of Confirmation of the Tartar Kans.

The Grand Vizir Celebi Mehemmed was deposed on the 21st inst, and the next Day banished to Tenedos. He is succeeded by Seid Mehemmed, who is replaced by the President of the Imperial Treasury, whose Office is filled by a younger Brother of the present Vizir.

The Chief or Superintendent of the Mint is made Chief of the Pursuivants, in the Room of Suleiman Effendi, appointed to carry the Sabre and Turban to Shahin Ghirai Kan; and the Sultan's private Secretary succeeds to the Place of Superintendent of the Mint. The Pathaw of Aleppo, Izzet Achmet, was dismissed from his Post on the 30th, and also from his Rank of Pashaw. Abdi, Pashaw of Salonica, is appointed to the Pashawlick of Aleppo.

There have lately been frequent Fires in this Capital; and, in several Quarters, Trains of combustible Matter have been discovered, which were undoubtedly laid with Intention to burn the City.

*Dresden, September 29.* Tomorrow the Elector and Electoral Family will return from Pilnitz to this City for the Winter.

*Hambourg, October 8.* Advice was received here Yesterday from Ploen of the Death, on the 6th Instant, of her Serene Highness Princess Christina Irmgard, Dutchess Dowager of the last Reigning Duke Frederick Charles of Holstein Ploen, in the 69th Year of her Age.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HILEAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 24th of last Month, to direct, that no Person or Persons whatsoever should, at any Time during the Space of Two Months, to commence from the Date of the said Order, presume to transport out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwise, any Plates of Copper, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council. And whereas it hath been represented to His Majesty at this Board, that the Continuance of the said Prohibition will be attended with Inconvenience and Detriment to the Persons concerned in the Trade and Manufacture of Copper in this Kingdom;—His Majesty, taking the same into Consideration, and being ever desirous to remove all Obstructions upon Trade, is hereby pleased, with the Advice of His

Privy Council, to permit and allow the carrying of Copper Coastwise from Port to Port; provided that sufficient Security by Bond be given to the proper Officers of His Majesty's Customs, in Treble the Value of the Copper intended to be sent Coastwise, to carry the same to the Places proposed, and none other, and to produce and deliver a Certificate or Certificates, within Two Months from the Date of the Bond, from the proper Officers of the Customs at the Ports for which any Copper shall be entered and cleared out, of the same having been all duly landed at such Ports; which Certificate or Certificates such Officer is hereby required to give; and the same Certificate or Certificates the Commissioners of the Customs are hereby required to transmit to the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in order to be laid before this Board: And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to permit and allow the Exportation of Copper to Foreign Parts (except to any of the Ports belonging to France or Spain) and all other Places to which the same might have been lawfully exported at the Time of making the said recited Order, upon Condition that all Copper intended for Exportation shall first be inspected and examined by an Agent or Agents, appointed or to be appointed by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy, and that a Certificate, under the Hand and Seal of the said Agent or Agents, shall be first had and obtained, setting forth, that no Part of the same consists of Plates of Copper, or Nails made in whole or in Part of Copper, which can be made Use of for the Purpose of sheathing and coppering Ships or Vessels; which Certificate from the said Agent shall be delivered to the proper Officers of the Customs at the Port in which the said Copper is intended to be shipped, and shall be their Authority for allowing the Quantity of Copper specified in the said Certificate to be put on Board and exported, any Thing contained in His Majesty's said Order in Council of the 24th of last Month to the contrary thereof notwithstanding — And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 25th Day of October, 1776, to promise and declare, That the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to every such Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who should, on or before the 31st of December then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board such Tenders as should be employed for raising Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majesty was also pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 8th Day of November, 1776, to promise and declare, That a Reward of Two Pounds for every Able, and Thirty

Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might secrete themselves, that so such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's said Service, by any of His Majesty's Sea-Officers employed for raising Men, on or before the 31st Day of December, 1776: And whereas His Majesty was likewise pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 15th Day of August 1777, to promise and declare, That every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should voluntarily enter himself to serve on Board any of His Majesty's Ships, on or before the 31st Day of October then next, should receive, as of His Majesty's Royal Bounty, the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, to be paid in Manner thereby directed: And whereas the Time limited by the said Proclamations, for Payment of the said Bounties and Rewards, hath been prolonged and extended to the 30th Day of this instant September; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the said Bounties and Rewards should be continued to be paid for some Time longer, His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy-Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the said Bounties and Rewards be prolonged and extended from the said 30th Day of this instant September to the 31st Day of December next, inclusive. — Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.
