Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that the Town of Northampton has been lately much alarmed by three several Fires, and that there is not the least Doubt but the two last were wilfully and maliciously contrived to involve the whole Town in the Conflagrations:

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in kindling the said Fires, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person or Persons who actually kindled the said Fires) who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
