Hereas the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 20th of August last, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwise, Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire on the 23d of this instant November: And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Pro-hibition should be continued for some Time longer, except in those Cases where (for the Benesit and Advantage of Trade, and for the Use and Defence of Ships trading to Foreign Parts, and of the Transports and Victualling Vessels employed in His Majesty's Service) His Majesty, by His several Orders in Council of the 13th and 27th of October, and of the 6th and 22d of November, 1775, of the 5th and 19th of February, and the 23d of August and 25th of September, 1776, of the 16th of April, the 13th of August, and the 3d and 10th of October, 1777, of August, and the 3d and 10th of October, 1777, of the 19th of June, the 7th and 26th of August, and the 10th of September 1778, has thought proper to permit and allow the Exportation of, and carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder, Saltpetre, Arms and Ammunition, under certain Conditions and Restrictions mentioned in the faid Orders: His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whosoever (except the Master-General, Lieutenant-General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance, for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Three Months, to commence from the faid 23d Day of this instant November, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwise, any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ampowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ampowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ampowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ampower. munition, on Board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwise, except in the Cases comprized within the aforementioned Orders in Council, without Leave or Permission in that

And whereas, in Pursuance of the Power so reserved | Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or Mis Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the 29th Year of His late Majesty's Reign, entituled, "An Act to impower His Majesty to prohibit the Ex-"portation of Saltpetre, and to enforce the Law

THEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 24th of September last, to direct, that no Person or Persons whoso-ever should, at any Time during the Space of Two Months, to commence from the Date of the faid Order, presume to transport out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Plates of Copper, or ship or lade any Plates of Copper on Board any Sh p or Vessel, in order to transporting the same beyond the Seas, or carry the same Coastwise, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesly or His Privy Council. whereas His Majesty was pleased, by another Order in Council, bearing Date the 7th of October, to permit and allow, under certain Provisoes and Conditions, the carrying of Copper Coastwise from Port to Port, and also the Exportation thereof to Foreign Parts, and all other Places to which the same might have been lawfully exported at the Time of making the above-recited Order (except to any of of the Ports belonging to France or Spain). And whereas upon the humble Memorial of the Smelters and Manufacturers of Copper in Great Britain, the Provisoes and Conditions of the said last-mentioned Order have been varied, and other Rules and Regulations have been established in Lieu thereof. And whereas the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 24th of September, for prohibiting the Exportation or carrying of Copper Coattwife, will expire on the 24th of this inftant November, and it is judged expedient that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, so as that the Exportation or carrying of Copper Coastwife may continue to be restrained, under the Rules and Regulations above-recited to have been established in that Behalf .- His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, that the said Prohibition be continued for Three Months, to commence from the faid 24th Day of this inflant November; but it is His Majesty's Pleasure that the same shall not be taken to extend to any Sort of Copper, to be Exported or sent Coastwife for His Majesty's Service, by Order and under the Directions or Licence of the Commissioners of the Navy, nor to prevent the transporting or carrying Coastwife of any Sort of Copper (except Sheets of Copper of and under the Weight of Two and an Half Pounds to the Foot Superficial) without any Security being reguired ;
