

And whereas, in Pursuance of the Power so reserved to His Majesty, His Majesty, by His Order in Council of the 7th of May last, published in Three successive Gazettes, was graciously pleased to suspend and stop the further Execution of the said Act from and after the 22d Day of the said Month of May, until further Notice, throughout every County and Place in South Britain, except the Cities, Towns and Places, mentioned in the said recited Order: And whereas it is expedient for His Majesty's Service to cause the said Suspension to be taken off: His Majesty is hereby pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to declare His Royal Will and Pleasure, that the aforementioned Suspension put to the Execution of the said Act, be now taken off. And His Majesty doth hereby strictly order, charge, and command, all the Commissioners and other His Majesty's loving Subjects authorized to carry the said Act into Execution in those Counties and Places where the above Suspension has taken Place, pursuant to His Majesty's aforementioned Order in Council of the 7th of May last, that they do forthwith reassemble themselves, and proceed with their utmost Diligence in carrying the said Act into Execution, pursuant to the Directions therein contained.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 20th of August last, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwise, Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire on the 23d of this instant November: And whereas it is judged expedient that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, except in those Cases where (for the Benefit and Advantage of Trade, and for the Use and Defence of Ships trading to Foreign Parts, and of the Transports and Victualling Vessels employed in His Majesty's Service) His Majesty, by His several Orders in Council of the 13th and 27th of October, and of the 6th and 22d of November, 1775, of the 5th and 19th of February, and the 23d of August and 25th of September, 1776, of the 16th of April, the 13th of August, and the 3d and 10th of October, 1777, of the 19th of June, the 7th and 26th of August, and the 10th of September 1778, has thought proper to permit and allow the Exportation of, and carrying Coastwise, Gunpowder, Saltpetre, Arms and Ammunition, under certain Conditions and Restrictions mentioned in the said Orders: His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whosoever (except the Master-General, Lieutenant-General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance, for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Three Months, to commence from the said 23d Day of this instant November, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwise, any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwise, except in the Cases comprized within the aforementioned Orders in Council, without Leave or Permission in that

Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and suffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the 29th Year of His late Majesty's Reign, entituled, "An Act to impower His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Saltpetre, and to enforce the Law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms and Ammunition; and also to impower His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwise of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition."—And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 24th of September last, to direct, that no Person or Persons whosoever should, at any Time during the Space of Two Months, to commence from the Date of the said Order, presume to transport out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwise, any Plates of Copper, or ship or lade any Plates of Copper on Board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same beyond the Seas, or carry the same Coastwise, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council. And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by another Order in Council, bearing Date the 7th of October, to permit and allow, under certain Provisoes and Conditions, the carrying of Copper Coastwise from Port to Port, and also the Exportation thereof to Foreign Parts, and all other Places to which the same might have been lawfully exported at the Time of making the above-recited Order (except to any of the Ports belonging to France or Spain). And whereas upon the humble Memorial of the Smelters and Manufacturers of Copper in Great Britain, the Provisoes and Conditions of the said last-mentioned Order have been varied, and other Rules and Regulations have been established in Lieu thereof. And whereas the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 24th of September, for prohibiting the Exportation or carrying of Copper Coastwise, will expire on the 24th of this instant November, and it is judged expedient that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, so as that the Exportation or carrying of Copper Coastwise may continue to be restrained, under the Rules and Regulations above-recited to have been established in that Behalf.—His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, that the said Prohibition be continued for Three Months, to commence from the said 24th Day of this instant November; but it is His Majesty's Pleasure that the same shall not be taken to extend to any Sort of Copper, to be Exported or sent Coastwise for His Majesty's Service, by Order and under the Directions or Licence of the Commissioners of the Navy, nor to prevent the transporting or carrying Coastwise of any Sort of Copper (except Sheets of Copper of and under the Weight of Two and an Half Pounds to the Foot Superficial) without any Security being required;
