Brussels, November 26.

THE contagious Distemper among the Horned Cattle has again made its Appearance in these Provinces. The Districts where it principally prevails are the Parts of Flanders and Brabant which border upon the Dutch Frontier; and, in order to prevent the farther Spreading of the Infection, this Government has issued out an Ordinance prohibiting the Importation of Cattle or Hides from those Districts into any other Parts of these Provinces; they have likewise renewed in general, with regard to all Places where the Infection shall discover itself, the Regulations which were put in Practice when it raged with so much Violence in this Country Ten Years ago, and which, as they were then so effectual as very shortly to suppress the Disorder, though universally prevalent, will, it is hoped, be equally successful at present in stopping the Progress of it.
