Creditors of Fairbeard Swinburn, late of Devonshire-street, Apothecary.

Whereas Mrs. Ann Staines, deceased, did, by her Will, give to Henry Fothergill, of Bedford-row in the Parish of St. Andrew Holborn, a small Sum of Money upon Trust, to pay or apply the same towards discharging the Debts that should or might be justly due and owing from her Cousin Fairbeard Swinburn, at the Time of her Decease.
