That a General Court of the said Company will be held at their House in Leadenhall-Street, on Thursday the 3d of February next, at Eleven o'Clock in the Forenoon, to consider the Terms of an Agreement proposed between the Public and the Company respecting their Charter.

THE Court of Directors of the United Company of Merchants of England trading to the East-Indies, do hereby give Notice,

That a General Court of the said Company will be held at their House in Leadenhall-Street, on Thursday the 3d of February next, from Eleven o'Clock in the Forenoon until Six in the Evening, for the Determination: by Ballot, of the following Question, viz.

“ That such Part of the 8th Bye Law which restrains the Court of Directors from investing any of the Company's Money or Effects in Shipping, except such small Ships as they may have Occasion to employ in the East Indies, be suspended for the Space of Twelve Months, in order to enable the Company to build out of Hand Two Ships only at Bombay for warlike or commercial Purposes.”
