Charleville, June 15. The Duke of Luxemburg having been encamped fome dayes with the Army under his command, as Buse and Ubay in the Neighborhood of Senef, decamped the 111 instant, and marched to Escauffiennes between Monsand Bruffels. The 12, the Sieur de Monial, Governot of Charleroy, parted from Philipville with 57 pieces of Cannon, being of those that were brought from Maestricht, and the next day he arrived here, where helleft 30 pieces, the rest will be put in feveral places on the Meuft, except those that are unserviceable, which will be carried to Dougs to be new Cast. The Confederate Troops begin to march towards Ruremond Theig, the Duke of Luxemburg parted from Escaussiennes, and encamped between Heif and Grammont, where he will continue some dayes. 'The Prince of Orange continues his quarters in the Countrey of Dendermands

Metz, Funcits. The Duke of Dorrale being advanced to the Seille, paffed it the 9th instant at night, and posted his Army from Nomeny to Port-Sur-Seille; the Mareschal de Crequi encamping the King's Army from the Hillmear Pont a Mouffon to Bouxietes ; by that means covering Pont à Mouffon, and preferving the communication with Nancy and Metz. We expect every hour to hear of a Battel, outhat the Duke of Lorrain is repasted the Seille.
