St. James's, April 25, 1780.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, That on Sunday Morning last, about One o'Clock, the Dwelling-House of Dr. John Miller, of Maynard's Farm, near Epping, in the County of Essex, was burglariously broken open by several Persons unknown, supposed to be Four in Number, who, after plundering the House of many Things, did, in the most inhuman, barbarous, and cruel Manner, cut and wound the said Dr. Miller to so dreadful a Degree, that his Life is greatly despaired of:

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice, the Persons concerned in the said Offences, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One of them, (except the Person or Persons who cut and wounded the said Dr. Miller) who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
