AT the Court at St. James's, the 10th of May, 1780,

P R E S E N T; The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the 16th of February laft, for prohibit-K V 16th of February laß, for prohibit-ing the Exportation or Carrying of Copper Coathwife (except under the Rules and Regulations therein expressed) will expire on the 24th of this instant May; and it being judged expedient that the faid Prohibition should be continued for fome Time longer, fo as that the Exportation or carrying of Copper Coast-wife may continue to be reftrained, under the Rules and Regulations established in that Rehalf: --His and Regulations established in that Behalf ;-His and Regulations established in that benait; — His Majefty is thereupon pleafed, by and with the Ad-vice of His Privy Council, to order, that the faid Prohibition be continued for Three Months, to com-mence from the 24th Day of this inflant May; but it is His Majefty's Pleafure that the fame fhall not be taken to extend to any Sort of Copper to be Exported or fent Coastwife for His Majesty's Service, by Order and under the Directions or Li-cence of the Commiffioners of the Navy, nor to prevent the transporting or carrying Coaltwife of any Sort of Copper (except Sheets of Copper of and under the Weight of Two and an Half Pounds to the Foot Superficial) without any Security being required; nor to the exporting the fame to any Parts beyond the Sea, to which it may lawfully be ex-ported (except to any of the Ports belonging to France or Spain) upon Condition that all fuch Cop-per as is intended for Exportation shall be infpected and examined by an Agent or Agents, ap-pointed of to be appointed by the Commillioners of His Majefty's Navy; and that a Certificate, under the Hand and Seal of the faid Agent or Agents, shall be first had and obtained, fetting forth, that no Part of the fame consists of Plates of Copper, or Sheets of Copper (except as hereinafter excepted) or Nails made in Whole or in Part of Copper, which can be made Ule of for the Purpole of fheathing and coppering Ships or Veffels; which Certificate from the faid Agent shall be delivered to the proper Officers of the Cuftoms at the Port in which the faid Copper is intended to be fhipped, and fhall be their Authority for allowing the Quantity of Copper specified in the faid Certificate to be put on Board and exported.—And as touching Sheets of Copper of and under the Weight of Two Pounds and an Half to the Foot Superficial, His Majefly is further pleased to permit and allow the fame to be carried Coaltwife without any Reftriction, pro-vided that no greater Quantity than Ten Hundred Weight shall be laden on Board any one Ship, unlefs Security by Bond hath first been given to the proper Officers of the Customs, in Fre-ble the Value of the Copper intended to be fent Coastwife, to carry the fame to the Place proposed, and none other; and to produce and deliver a Cer-tificate or Certificates, within Four Months from the Date of the Bond, from the proper Officers of the Cultoms at the Ports for which fuch Copper shall be entered and cleared out, of the fame having been all duly landed at fuch Ports; which Cer-

tificate or Certificates fuch Officer is required to give, and the Commissioners of the Cuf. toms to transmit to the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in order to be laid before this Board: And His Majefty is likewife pleafed to permit and allow the Exportation of Sheets of Copper of and under the Weight of Two Pounds and an Half to the Foot Superficial to any Parts beyond the Seas, to which the fame may be lawfully exported (except to any of the Ports belonging to France or Spain.) upon Condition that no more than Ten Hundred Weight of fuch Copper shall be ex-ported by any one Person or Partnership, and that the Quantity laden or put on Board any one Ship or Veffel, shall not exceed Three Tons in the whole; and also upon Condition that such Sheets of Copper fhall be first inspected and examined by the Agent or Agents appointed or to be appointed by the Com-millioners of His Majesty's Navy; and that a Certificate, under the Hand and Seal of fuch Agent of Agents shall be first had and obtained, fetting forth, that fuch Sheets of Copper are of and under the Weight above defcribed.-And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treafury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty; and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein; as to them may respectively appertain.

P R E-S E N T, The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council. Whereas the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the 16th of February laft, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coaftwife, Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire on the 23d of this inflant May : And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Prohibition fhould be continued for fome Timë longer, except in those Cafes where (for the Benefit and Advantage of Trade, and for the Ufe and Defence of Ships trading to Fareign Pares, and of the Transports and Victualling Veffels employed in His Majefty's Service) His Majefty, by His feveral Orders in Council of the 13th and 27th of October, and of the 6th and 22d of November, 1775, of the 5th and 19th of February, and the 23d of August and 25th of September, 1776, of the 16th of April, the 13th of August, and the 3d and 10th of October, 1777, of the roth of June, the 7th and 25th of August, and the 10th of September, 1778, has thought proper to permit and allow the Exportation of, and carrying Coaftwife; Gunpowder, Saltpetre, Arms and Ammunition, under certain Conditions and Restrictions mentioned in the faid Orders : His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever (except the Matter-General, Lieutenant-General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance, for His Majefty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Three Months, to commence from the faid 23d Day of
