R O C L A M A T I O N. A EORGE R.

HEREAS it hath been reprefented to Us, that a great Number of Perfons, in Confequence of Advertisements or

Hand Bills inciting them thereto, did, on Friday last the Second of this Instant June, af-femble in a Riotous and Tumultuous Manner in Saint George's Fields, in the County of Surry; from whence they proceeded in feveral Bodies to Palace-Yard, Weftminster, surrounded both Houses of Parliament, and possessed themselves of the Avenues to the fame, (the faid Houses of Parliament being then fitting) where they continued in a Riotous and Tumultuous Manner, committing great Outrages and Violence against feveral of Our Subjects, and felonioully taking Money from them; after which, in the Evening of the fame Day, they infulted and attacked the Houfes of fome of the Publick Minifters of Foreign Princes and States, refiding at Our Court, and broke into, fpoiled, and fet Fire to Chapels, which in every civilized Country are al-lowed to luch Publick Ministers for the free Exercife of the Religion of their Country, to the great Scandal and Offence of all truly pious and good Proteftants; We therefore, in order that the Re-proach of fo frantick and atrocious an Outrage against the Precepts of Religion, as well as the Obligations of all Laws, may not remain a Difgrace to Our Kingdom, but may be confined to the Authors, Abettors, and Perpetrators of the faid Outrage, and that they may be brought to fpeedy and condign Punifhment, and that fuch dangerous and wicked Practices may hereafter be prevented; have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish and declare Our Refola-tion to put the Laws in Force against fuch Offences. And We do hereby enjoin and require all Juffices : And We do hereby enjoin and require all Juffices of the Peace, Sheriffs, Mayors, Bailiffs, Confta-bles, and all other Our loving Subjects, to be aid-ing and affifting to the utmost of their Power in fup-prefing fuch illegal and tumultuous Affemblies, and in direction appropriation and bridging to the in detecting, apprehending, and bringing to Juf-tice the Perfons concerned in affembling or, inftiga-ting the fame, and guilty of any of the Violences above mentioned: And for the better Detection of the Perfons who were concerned in the Outrages committed at the Houses of the faid Publick Ministers, We are gracioufly pleafed to promife, that if any Perfon shall difcover any other Perfon or Perfons who, directly or indirectly, were concerned in pulling down, or beginning to pull down, or in fetting Fire to the Chapel of any Publick Minister, fo as that the Person or Persons discovered may be profe-cuted for the same, such Discoverer shall have and receive, as a Reward, upon Conviction of fuch Offender or Offenders, the Sum of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and also Our Gracious Pardon for the faid Offence, in cafe the Perfon making fuch Dif-covery shall himself be liable to be profecuted for the same, except the Perfon who first broke into, or began to pull down or set Fire to the said Chapels. And the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Treasurer of Our Exchequer, are hereby required to make Payment of the faid Rewards accordingly.

HEREAS a great Number of diforderly Perfons have affembled themfelves together in a Riotous and Tumilituous Manner; and have been guilty of many Acts of Treafon and Rebellion; having made an Affault on the Gaol of Newgate; fet loofe the Prifoners confined therein, and fet Fire to and definoyed the faid Prifon: And whereas Houfes are now pulling down in feveral Parts of Our Cities of London and Weftminfler, and Libera Our Cities of London and Weftminster, and Liberaties thereof, and Fires kindled for confuming the Materials and Furniture of the fame, whereby it is Materials and Furniture of the fame, whereby it is become abfolutely neceffary to use the most effec-tual Means to quiet fuch Disturbances, to preferve the Lives and Properties of Individuals; and to re-flore the Peace of the Country: We therefore, taking the fame into Our most ferious Confi-deration; have thought fit, by and with the Ad-vice of Our Privy Council; to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation; hereBy strictly charging and exhorting all Our loving Subjects to preferve the. Peace, and to keep themselves, their Servants and Peace, and to keep themfelves, their Servants and Apprentices, quietly within their respective Dwel-lings, to the End that all well-disposed Persons ings, to the End that all well-dipoled regions may avoid those Milchiefs which the Continuance of fuch riotous Proceedings may bring upon the. Guilty : And as it is neceffary, from the Circum-ftances before-mentioned, to employ the Military Force, with which We are by Law entrufied, for the immediate Supprellion of fuch Rebellious and Traiterous Attempts, now making against the Peace and Dignity of Our Crown, and the Safety of the Lives and Properties of Our Subjects, We have therefore issued the most direct and effectual Orders to all Our Officers, by an immediate Exertion of their utmost Force, to reprefs the fame; of which all Perfons are to take Notice.

W Hereas a great Number of diforderly Perfons have for feveral Days paft affembled them-feives together, in a Riotous and Tumultuous Manner, and have been guilty of many Acts of Treason; Rebellion, and Felony, having formed Defigns to break open and defiroy the Gaols and Prifons, and to fet loofe the Prifoners confined therein, and having actually broke into and fet on Fire the Gaol of New-gate, the King's Bench Prilon, and the Prilon of the Fleet, and releafed the Prifoners; and made Attempts on other Gaols and Prifons in and about this Metropolis; and having fet Fire to and pulled down the Dwelling-houles of divers of Our peace-able Subjects, and also fet Fire to, burnt and de-ftroyed the Materials thereof, and the Furniture and other Effects found therein; and allo taken Money from divers of Our Subjects: We therefore, taking the fame into Our molf ferious Con-fideration, have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publifit and declare Our Refolution, That the Authors, Abettorsy
