GEORGE R. 7 Hereas a great Number of diforderly Perfons have for leveral Days pail affembled them-: felves together, in a Riotous and Tumultuous Manner, and nave been guilty of many Acts of Treason. Rebellion, and Felony, having formed Defigns to break open and deftroy the Gaols and Prifons, and to fet loofe the Prifoners confined therein, and having actually broke into and fet on Fire the Gaoi of Newgate, the King's Bench Prifon, and the Prifon of the Fleet, and released the Prisoners; and made Attempts on other Gaols and Prifons in and about this Metropolis; and having fet Fire to and pulled down the Dwelling-houses of divers of Our peaceable Subjects, and alfo. fet Fire to, burnt and deftroyed the Materials thereof, and the Furniture and other Effects found therein; and also taken Money from divers of Our Subjects: We therefore, taking the fame into Our most ferious Con-fideration, have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy, Council, to publish and declare Our Resolution, That the Authors, Abettors, and Perpetrators of the faid Offences be prolecuted as expeditioufly as may be, according to the due Courfe of Law; and we do hereby enjoin and require all Justices of the Peace, She-riffs, Mayors, Bailiffs, Constables, and all -other Our loving Subject's, to be aiding and affifting to the utmost of their Power, in detecting, apprehending and bringing to Justice the faid Offenders. And We are gracioufly pleafed to promife, that if any Perfon shall discover any other Perfon or Perfons who are guilty of any of the faid Offences, fo as that the Perfon or Perfons discovered may be profecuted for the fame, fuch Discoverer shall have and receive, as a Reward, upon Conviction of fuch Offender or Offenders, the Sum-of FIF Γ Y POUNDS, and also Our Gracious Pardon for the faid Offence, in Cafe the Perfon making fuch Difcovery shall himself be liable to be profecuted for the fame; and the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Treasurer of Our Exchequer are hereby required to make Payment accordingly of the faid Rewards.

THEREAS Information has been received, about this Metropolis were encouraged and aberted by Money, or other Rewards, given, or promifed to be given, to the Perfons concerned therein ; .and alfo Bells, Flags, and other Signals and Devices, were uted during the faid Riots and Tumults, to direct the Rioters in their Criminal Acts and Proceedings, and to give Notice of Attempts or Preparations to fupprefs, refift, or interrupt the fame : We therefore, taking the fame into Our molt ferious Confideration, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, in order to detect and bring to Juffice the Perfons guilty of any of the Criminal Acts above mentioned, are gracioully pleafed to promile, That if any Perfon shall discover any other Perfon or Perfons, who by themfelves, or their Agents, gave |

or offered, or promiled to give, any Money, or other Reward, to any Perfon or Perfons, to engage or continue in the faid Riots or Lumalts, or to do or affift in any of the Criminal Acts committed during the Continuance of the faid Riots and Tumults, or who made use of any Bells, Flags, or other Signals or Devices, to direct the Rioters in any of their Criminal Acts and Proceedings, or to give Notice of Attempts or Preparations to Suppress, refift, or interrupt the fame, fo as that the Perfon or Persons discovered may be profesuted, such Ditcoverer shall have and receive as a Reward, upon Conviction of such Offender or Offenders, the Sum of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS; and the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Treasurer of Our Exchequer are hereby required to make Payment thereof accordingly

7 HEREAS His Majetty was gracioully pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 25th Day of October, 1776, to promise and declare, That the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to every such Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor-under the Age of Eighteen Years, who fhould, on or before the 31 ft of December then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majetty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as should be employed for raising Men for the Service of the Royal Navy : And whereas His Majefty was also pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 8th Day of No-vember, 1776, to promife and declare, That a Reward of Two Pounds for every Able, and Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to any Perfon who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might fecrete themfelves, that fo fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's faid Service, by any of His Majesty's Sea-Officers employed for raifing Men, on or before the 31lt Day of December, 1776 : And whereas His Majefty was like-wife pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the r5th Day of August, 1777, to promise and declare, That every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who thould voluntarily enter himfelf to ferve on Board any of His Majefty's Ships, on or before the 31st Day of October then next, should receive, as of His Majesty's Royal Bounty, the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, to be paid in Manner thereby directed : And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations, for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards, hath been prolonged and extended to the 30th Day of this inftant June; and it being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service that the faid Bounties and Rewards should be continued to be paid for some Time longer, His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy
