St. James's, July 22, 1780. HE following Address of the States of the Island of Jersey having been trans-mitted by the Right Honourable General Conway, Governor of the faid Ifland,

to the Earl of Hillsborough, One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has by him been prefented to His Majesty : Which Address His Majesty was pleafed to receive very gracioufly.

To the KING's Moft Excellent Majefty,

The humble Address of the States of the Island of Jerfey.

W E your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the States of your Majesty's Island of Jerley, ever zealous for the Profperity of your Majesty's aufpicious Reign, and alarmed at whatever may disturb the Happiness of it, beg Leave to express to your Majesty our Abhorrence and Detestation of the late rebellious Infurrections which have been excited in the Metropolis of your Majefly's Dominions, and our Joy upon the happy Reftoration of public Tranquility, effected by those wise Measures which your Majesty di-rected in this urgent Necessity, when all lawful Authority and Government were so wickedly infulted.

We beg Leave to offer our Congratulation on the glorious Succeffes which have lately been ob-tained by the Arms of your Majefty ; and we fervently pray the Almighty to grant to your Ma-jefty an uninterrupted Courfe of them.

The timely and powerful Protection granted by your Majesty to your faithful Subjects of this Island, in the Time of the most imminent Danger, demands our grateful Acknowledgments; and we beg Leave to affure your Majesty, that we shall do our utmost Exertions to merit a Continuance of your Majesty's paternal Attention, by the most zealous and inceffant Fidelity, Obedience, and Attachment to your Royal Perfon and Government.

Admiralty-Office, July 22, 1780. Extract of a Letter from the Honourable Captain Waldegrave, of His Majesty's Ship La Prudente, to Mr. Stephens, dated Spithead, July 18, 1780.

O N the 4th Inftant, being on a Cruize with the Licorne in Company, at Ten o'Clock A. M. Cape Ortugal then bearing South and by Weft, Dif-tance 24 Leagues, the Licorne made the Signal for fee-ing a Sail in the N. W. and a thick Fog then difperfing, we discovered a large Ship bearing down to us: I immediately made the Signal to chace, soon after which, the Chace hauling her Wind, being then only Six Miles Diftance from us, we clearly difcovered her to be a large Frigate, which, from her

Confiruction, we concluded to be French. As we had light Winds and Calms the whole Day, it was Half past Eleven P. M. e're I found myself within close Pistol-shot of her. The Signals; the now made, both with Rockets and Lights, convincing me that fne was an Enemy, I immediately, began to engage her; and at Half palt Four A. M. the hauled down her Colours to His Majefty's Ships La Prudente and Licorne.

She proved to be La Carpricieuse, a French Fil-gate, Eight Days from L'Orient, pierced for 44

Guns, but mounting only 32; Complement 308 Men. She was launched in March last, measured 1100 Tons, and was one of the finest Frigates I ever faw.

I am very forry to fay, that the Condition of the Prize was such (as their Lordships may observe from the Report of the Survey) as rendered it impracticable to efcort her to England. Indeed the very heavy Lofs I had fuftained in the Action, and un-fortunately having 20 fick on Shore, and many on Board, made it abfolutely impossible for me to give her the neceffary Affistance for that Purpose; I therefore, after removing the Prifoners, fet her on Fire

Finding from the Condition of my Ship the utter Impoffibility of executing my Orders, I have there-fore given Directions to Captain Cadogan, the Commander of His Majesty's Ship Licorne, to put them into immediate Execution.

Notwithstanding our feeming Superiority, I hope the Return of the killed and wounded will fufficiently evince, that my Officers and Ship's Company have acquitted themfelves in the most gallant and spirited Manner. Indeed I feel 'tis impossible to do uffice to their Merits.

In Justice to Lieutenant Binks of the Marines, I must beg Leave to observe to their Lordships, that his Party behaved with the utmost Steadiness and his Farty behaved with the utmoit of additional and Bravery, keeping up a regular and conflant Fire from the Beginning of the Action, 'till Neceffity called them to the great Guns, where they fibewed an equal Share of Spirit and good Order. But while I am thus giving those well-deferved Encomiums to His Britannick Majefty's Subjects, I fhould feel myfelf in Honour bound to give His Enemies, on this Occasion, the Merits they are for

Enemies, on this Occasion, the Merits they are for truly deferving, did not the Condition of their Ship,' and the heavy Lofs they have fuftained, fufficiently fpeak their Praifes. I must beg Leave to add, in Honour of M. de Cherval, who commanded La Carpricieuse at the Time she furrendered, that the Colours were not hauled down till the Ship had five Feet Water in her Hold.

Monf. de Ranfanne and Monf. de Fontaine, the First and Second Captains, both fell in the Action 5 but, as to their farther Lofs, we are as yet ignorant, being unacquainted with the Number of Pri-foners on board the Licorne; but from a rough Calculation of their Officers, they must have at least 100 killed and wounded.

It is with infinite Concern that I acquaint their Lordships, that Lieutenant Ellison stands foremost on the List of the Wounded, having been very feverely bruifed in the Back, and his Right Arm car-. ried off by a Shot. I must beg Leave to recom-mend his Misfortune, and the great Intrepidity he fhewed during the Action, to their Lordships most particular Attention.
