Excise is made payable, shall pay Annually the Sum of Five Shillings for a Licence for that Purpose.

And that every Person who shall keep a Diligence or Post-Coach, for the Purpose of conveying in the Inside thereof any Number of Passengers, not exceeding Four 3 or who shall keep any Coach or other Carriage to employed as a Public Stage Coach, shall pay Annually the Sum of Figue Shittings for a Licence for that Purpose the Sum of Five Shillings for a Licence for that Pur-

And it is Enacted, That from and after the faid 1st of August, 1780, no Person (except those whose Li-censes have been renewed pursuant to the Ast of the former Session of Parliament) shall lett out any Horse for Hire, either by the Mile or Stage, or by the Day or less Period of Time, to draw any Coach or other Carriage with Four Wheels, or any Chaife or Chair with Two Wheels, or any other Carriage upon which any Duty of Excise is made payable, unless such Person shall be authorised to do so by Licence under the Hands and Seals of Two of His Majesty's Commissioners for Managing the Stamp Duties, or some Person authorised by them, upon Pain of Forfeiting, for every Offence, the Sum of Five Pounds.
