HEREAS it hath been reprefented to Us, that a great Number of Perfons, in Confequence of Advertifements or Hand Bills inciting them the states

Hand Bills inciting them thereto, did, on Friday laft the Second of this Inftant June, af-femble in a Riotous and Tumultuous Manner in Saint Generation Fields Saint George's Fields, in the County of Surry, from whence they proceeded in feveral Bodies to Palace-Yard, Westminster, furrounded both Houses of Parliament, and poffeffed themfelves of the Avenues to the fame, (the faid Houfes of Parliament being to the tame, (the taid Floutes of Parliament being then fitting) where they continued in a Riotous and Tumultuous Manner, committing great Outrages and Violence againft feveral of Our Subjects, and felonioufly taking Money from them; after which, in the Evening of the fame Day, they infulted and attacked the Houfes of fome of the Publick Mini-flers of Foreign Princes and States, refiding at Our Court. and broke into. fooiled. and fet Fire to Court, and broke into, spoiled, and set Fire to Chapels, which in every civilized Country are al-lowed to fuch Publick Ministers for the free Exerlowed to luch rublick Minuters for the free Exer-cife of the Religion of their Country, to the great Scandal and Offence of all truly pious and good Proteflants; We therefore, in order that the Re-proach of fo frantick and atrocious an Outrage againft the Precepts of Religion, as well as the Obligations of all Laws, may not remain a Dif-grace to Our Kingdom, but may be confined to the Authors. Abettors. and Perpetrators of the faid Authors, Abettors, and Perpetrators of the faid Outrage, and that they may be brought to speedy and condign Punishment, and that fuch dangerous and wicked Practices may hereafter be prevented, have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish and declare Our Refolution to put the Laws in Force against fuch Offences : And We do hereby enjoin and require all Justices of the Peace, Sheriffs, Mayors, Bailiffs, Constables, and all other Our loving Subjects, to be aid ing and affifting to the utmost of their Power in fupprefling fuch illegal and tumultuous Affemblies, and in detecting, apprehending, and bringing to Juf-tice the Perfons concerned in affembling or inftiga-ting the fame, and guilty of any of the Violences above mentioned : And for the better Detection of the Perfons who were concerned in the Outrages comrefors who were concerned in the Outrages com-mitted at the Houfes of the faid Publick Ministers, We are graciously pleased to promise, that if any Person shall discover any other Person or Persons who, directly or indirectly, were concerned in pullwho, directly or instructly, were concerned in pull-ing down, or beginning to pull down, or in fetting Fire to the Chapel of any Publick Minifer, fo as that the Perfon or Perfons different may be profecuted for the fame, fuch Discoverer shall have and receive, as a Reward, upon Conviction of fuch Of. fender or Offenders, the Sum of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and alfo Our Gracious Pardon for the

faid Offence, in cafe the Perfon making fuch Difcovery shall himself be liable to be profecuted for the same, except the Perfon who first broke into, or began to pull down or set Fire to the said Chapels. And the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Treasurer of Our Exchequer, are hereby required to make Payment of the said Rewards accordingly.

HEREAS a great Number of diforderly Perfons have affembled themfelves together in a Riotous and Tumulture.

guilty of many Acts of Treason and Rebellion, having made an Affault on the Gaol of Newgate, fet loofe the Prisoners confined therein, and fet Fire to and deftroyed the faid Prifon: And whereas Houles are now pulling down in feveral Parts of Our Cities of London and Weftminfler, and Liber-ties thereof, and Fires kindled for confuming the Materials and Furniture of the furne wherehe is in Materials and Furniture of the fame, whereby it is become abfolutely necessary to use tame, whereby it is become abfolutely necessary to use the most effec-tual Means to quiet fuch Disturbances, to preferve the Lives and Properties of Individuals; and to re-flore the Peace of the Country: We therefore, taking the fame into Our most ferious Confi-deration have thereby for the and with the Adderation, have thought fit, by and with the Ad-vice of Our Privy Council, to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby firstly charging and Royal Proclamation, nereby itrictly charging and exhorting all Our loving Subjects to preferve the Peace, and to keep themfelves, their Servants and Apprentices, quietly within their respective Dwel-lings, to the End that all well-disposed Persons may avoid those Mischiefs which the Continuance of such ristons Proceedings may bring upon the of fuch riotous Proceedings may bring upon the Guilty : And as it is neceffary, from the Circumftances before-mentioned, to employ the Military Force, with which We are by Law entrufied, for the immediate Suppreffion of fuch Rebellious and Traiterous Attempts, now making against the Peace and Dignity of Our Crown, and the Safety of the Lives and Properties of Our Subjects, We have therefore issued the most direct and effectual Orders to all Our Officers, by an immediate Exertion of their utmost Force, to repress the fame; of which all Perfons are to take Notice.

Conflantinople, June 26. CCORDING to Letters from Bombay, dated March 15, and received here the 8th Instant, the English East India Company's Army, under the Command of General Goddard, had taken every Place to the Northward of Surat, and to the South-ward of Amadabad, the Capital of Guzzorat, which was likewife taken by Storm the 15th of February, with the Lofs of about 100 Men killed and wounded. General Goddard was on his Return to the Southward, and was within a few Miles of the Mahratta Armies; the Generals of which were making Pro-pofals of Peace, and, as a Preliminary, had delivered up Two English Gentlemen, who had been in their Hands for leveral Months.

Sir Edward Hughes was arrived with his Squadron at Madrafs, and all the Eaft India Fleets which failed from England in March and May, 1779, were likewise arrived in different Ports in India, not a Ship being missing.

Peterfburgh, June 30. The Emperor arrived here laft Wedneiday Noon, and paffed the following Day with the Empreis at Czarfko-Zelo, returning in the Evening to his Apartments at Count Cobenzel's. To-day his Imperial Majefty goes back to Czarfko-Zelo.

W Hereas, by an Act paffed in the last Seffion of Parliament, for repealing an Act made in the 19th Year of the Reign of His prefent Majesty, intituled, "An Act for granting to His Majesty certain Duties on Licenses to be taken out by all Persons leiting Horses to Hire for Travelling, in the Manner therein mentioned, and certain Duties on all Horses " 46 " lett to Hire, for the Purposes of Travelling Post, " and by Time, and upon certain Carriages therein " and by Time, and upon certain Carriages therein "mentioned; and for granting other Duties in Lieu "thereof," it is Enacted, That from and after the 1/1 Day of August, 1780, every Person in Great Bri-tain who shall lett to Hire any Horse, for the Purpose of Travelling Post by the Mile, or from Scage to Scage, or being a Person actually letting Horses to Hire, shall lett to Hire for a Day or any lets Period Scare lett to Hire for a Day, or any lefs Period of Time, any Horfe for drawing any Coach or other Carriage with Four Wheels, in any Chaife or Chair with Two Wheels, or any other Carriage for which any Duty of Excise is made payable, shall pay Annually the Sum of Five Shillings for a Licence for that Purpose

And that every Person who shall keep a Diligence or Post-Coach, for the Purpose of conveying in the Infide increof any Number of Passengers, not exceeding Four; or who shall keep any Coach or other Carriage to be employed as a Public Stage-Coach, thall pay Annually the Sum of Five Shillings for a Licence for that Purpofe.

And it is Enacled, That from and after the faid 1st of August, 1780, no Person (except those whose Licenses have been renewed pursuant to the AE of the former Seffion of Parliament) shall lett out any Horse for Hire, either by the Mile or Stage, or by the Day or lefs Period of Time, to draw any Coach or other Carriage with Four Wheels, or any Chaife or Chair with I wo Wheels, or any other Carriage upon which any Duty of Excise is made payable, unless fuch Person shall be authorifid to do fo by Licence under the Hands and Seals of Truo of His Majesty's Commissioners for Mana ging the Stamp Duties, or some Person authorised by them, upon Pain of Forfeiting, for every Offence, the Sum of Five Pounds.

And it is further Enacted, That no Person (except as before excepted) shall keep a Diligence or Post Coach, or any other Carriage to be employed as a Public Stage-Coach, without baving first obtained a License under the Hands of Two of the said Commissioners, upon Pain to forfeit, for every Time Juch Carriage shall be fo used,

the Sun of Five Pounds. Notice is hereby given to all Poftmafters, Innkeepers, Proprietors of Diligences, Stage-Coaches, and others whom it may concern, that Daily At-tendance will be given at the Office in Cook's court near Lincoln's-inn, for the Purpole of granting Licenfes and taking Bonds under the faid Act -And, to prevent the Confusion and Delay which may happen, if too many Perfons attend at the fame Time together, it is defired that all those who are liable to these Duties will forthwith apply for their Licenfes ; when they will receive Extracts from the faid Act, containing full Influctions and Directions for their Guidance therein.
