Most gracious Sovereign,

E beg Leave to approach your Majefty, to exprets the genuine and unfeigned Senfe we entertain of the mild and conftitutional Government exercised by your Majetty over every rart of your extensive Dominions; and of the peculiar Happinels we, and the reft of our Fellow Subjects, enjoy in confequence of it: Such being the Cale. it was with great Concern and Surprize that we beheld fome of your Majefty's Subjects, who appear not to have been affected with these Sentiments of Duty and Gratituoe, fo natural, fo jult, and becoming. Ignorant, enthusiallick, and intolerant; and perhaps actuated by Motives less excuteable than thefe, they have formed themselves into illegal Affociations, daringly appeared in formiuable Numbers and holtile Array, menaced the Legiflacure, and finally proceeded to the Committion of every Act the most outrageous and violent.

Whillt we deplore the extensive and complicated Mifery which has arilen from fuch unequalied and a provoked Kiots, and that any of your Majery's Subjects fronte have been guilty of Urimes to attocious, we at the tame Time are happy to obferve the wife Councils, the neteffary, legal and effectual Methods purfued by your Wajefly for the uppreffion of the Rioters, the Protection of the Innocent, and the Reftoration of the Public Tranquitity. And we contole ourselves with the Hope, that permamanent Good may arife from the late 'I rough s; particularly as univerfal and just senfe of the Neceffity of a outiful Behaviour as Subjects, and of the ineffimable Value of publick Order and legal Government.

Happy in this Expectation, with Pleafure we turn our Eyes towards the State of your Majefly's Colonies in North America; and be $bcg \perp eave$ to exprefs before you the Joy we feel from the late diffinguished Success of your Majesty's Arms in the Re-duction of the Capital and Province of outh Carolina. We entertain the Hope, that this important Event will have a doubly good Effect; to intimirolina. date and over-awe the Remains of that defperate and Republican Faction, from which has originated the Rebellion in America, and all the Miferies confequent on it; and to flimulate the Well-affected through all the Colonies to unite in Sentiment and Effort with your Majelty's Servants, for terminating the Reign of Democracy, Tyranny, and Confusion; for accomplishing the Re-union of America with the Parent State, and all the Bleffings which flow from its orderly and free Constitution, governed by your Majesty with so much Justice, paternal Care, and Moderation.

We take Leave of your Majelty, requelling, that God, the Author of Order, and whole Power can controul every Event, would grant such effectual Success to your Majeity's Arms as may humble the Infelence
