dom, or carrying Coaftwile, Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire on the 23d of this instant August: And whereas it is judged expedient-that the faid Pro-hibition fhould be continued for fome Time longer, except in those Cafes where (for the Be-. hefit and Advantage of Trade, and for the Ufe and Defence of Ships trading to Foreign Parts, and of the Transports and Victualling Vessels employed in His Majesty's Service) His Majesty, by His scveral Orders in Council of the 13th and 27th of October, and of the 5th and 22d of November, 1775, of the 5th and 19th of February, and the 23d of August and 25th of September, 1776, of the 16th of April, the 23th of August, and the 3d and 10th of April, the ber, 1777, of the 19th of June, the 7th and 26th of August, and the 10th of September, 1778, and of the 17th of May last, has thought proper to permit and allow the Exportation of, and carrying Coastwife, Gunpow-der, Selepetre, Arms and Ammunition, under certain Conditions and Restrictions mentioned in the faid Orders : His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Rerfons whofoever (except the Mafter-General, Lieutenant-General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance, for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Three Months, to commence from the faid 23d Day of this inflant August, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or thip or lade any Gun-· powder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coastwise, except in the Cases com-prized within the aforementioned Orders in Council, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the 29th Year of His late Majetty's Reign, entituled, "An Act "to impower His Majefty to prohibit the Ex-"portation of Saltpetre, and to enforce the Law "for empowering His Majefty to, prohibit the "Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of "Arms and Ammunition; and alfo to impower " " His Majefty to reftrain the carrying Coaffwife " of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms " or Ammunition." - And the Lords Commiffioners of His Majelly's Treasury, the Commif-fioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Ad-. miral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the . Cinque Ports, the Master-General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may refpectively appertain.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 24th Day of September last, to prohibit the Transporting to any Parts out of this Kingdom, or Carrying Coastwife, any Plates of Copper, and Shipping and Lading any

Plates of Copper on Board any Ship or Veffel, in order to the Transporting the same beyond the Seas, or Carrying the fame Coastwife; without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council; which Prohibition hath been fince continued, and now fabfills under certain Exceptions and Refirictions: And whereas an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, to impower His Majesty. by Proclamation or Order in Council, for fuch Time as shall be therein expressed, to prohibit the Exporting, or Attempting to Export, out of this Kingdom, or the Carrying Coaffwife in this Kingdom, any Sort of Copper in Sheets, or Copper in Bars, therein defcribed, in fuch Manner, and under such Restraints, as His Majesty shall think fit: And His Majesty judging it necessary for the Publick Good, at this Critical Conjuncture, to prohibit the Exporting of Copper out of this Kingdom, or Carrying Coastwise the fame, His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, That no Person or Persons whatsoever do, at any 'Fime during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Date hereof, prefume to Ex-port, or attempt to Export, out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaftwife, any Copper in Sheets, of or under the Weight of Time Bounds and an Half to under the Weight of Two Pounds and an Half to the Foot Superficial, unless under the Restraints herein after contained ; or any other Copper, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council; but it is His Majesty's Pleasure, that the faid Prohibition shall not be taken to extend to any Sort of Copper to be Exported or fent Coastwife for His Majesty's Service, by Order and under the Directions or Licence of the Commissioners of the Navy, nor to prevent the transporting or carrying Coaftwife of any Sort of Copper (except Sheets of Copper of and under the Weight of Two and an Half Pounds to the Foot Superficial) without any Security being required; nor to the exporting the fame to any Parts beyond the Sea, to which it may lawfully be exported (except to any of the Ports belonging to France or Spain) upon Condition that all fuch Copper as is intended for Exportation shall be inspected and examined by an Agent or Agents, appointed or to be appointed by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy; and that a Certificate, under the Hand and Seal of the faid Agent or Agents, fhall be first had and obtained, fetting forth, that no Part of the fame confists of Plates of Copper, or Sheets of Copper (except as hereinafter excepted) or Nails made in Whole or in Part of Copper, which can be made Use of for the Purpose of sheathing and coppering Ships or Vessels; which Certificate from the faid Agent shall be delivered to the proper Officers of the Cuftoms at the Port in which the faid Copper is intended to be fnipped, and fhall be their Authority for allowing the Quantity of Copper specified in the faid Certificate to be put on Board and exported .- And as touching Sheets of Copper of and under the Weight of Two Pounds and an Half to the Foot Superficial, His Majefty is further pleafed to permit and allow the fame to be carried Coaftwife without any Reftriction, prowided that no greater Quantity than Ten Hundred Weight shall be laden on Board any one Ship, unlefs Security by Bond hath first been given to the proper Officers of the Customs, in Tre-ble the Value of the Copper intended to be fent Coaffwise, to carry the same to the Place proposed, and none other ; and to produce and deliver a Certificate or Certificates, within Four Months from the Date
