**T**HIS Day his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant went in State to the House of Peers with the usual Solemnity, and the Commons being sent for, gave the Royal Assent to the following Bills, viz.

An Act for the Advancement of Trade, and for granting to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, the several Duties therein mentioned.

An Act for continuing and amending several Laws relating to His Majesty's Revenue, and for the more effectually preventing of Frauds therein, and for such other Purposes as are therein mentioned.

An Act for explaining and amending an Act passed in the Fifteenth and Sixteenth Years of the Reign of George the Third, intituled, an Act for the better regulating the Pipe Water of the City of Dublin.

An Act for reviewing, continuing and amending several temporary Statutes.

An Act for the Relief of Persons who have omitted to qualify themselves according to Law.

An Act to amend and continue an Act passed in the Seventeenth and Eighteenth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, an Act to amend and continue an Act passed in the Thirteenth and Fourteenth Years of His present Majesty, intituled, an Act for the better regulating of the Baking Trade in the City of Dublin, and for other Purposes.

An Act to amend a Mistake in an Act passed in the Thirteenth and Fourteenth Years of His present Majesty, intituled, an Act for amending the Public Roads.

An Act to empower Grand Juries to contract for keeping the Public Roads in Repair.

An Act for amending the Acts of the Second and Eighth Years of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the First, and of the First Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, for Recovery of Small Debts in a Summary Way by Civil Bill, as far as they relate to the County of Dublin.

An Act for the better Regulation of the Woollen Manufacture of this Kingdom.

An Act for continuing several Temporary Statutes, and for amending an Act passed in the Eleventh and Twelfth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, for the better paving, cleansing, lighting, altering, and improving Sackville-Street and Marlborough-Street in the City of Dublin, and the Lanes and Avenues leading unto the same respectively; and for enabling the Corporations for badging the Poor within the County of Waterford, and the County of the City of Waterford, to unite and become one Corporation; and also for establishing a Body Corporate within the Town and Parish of Lisburne, in the County of Antrim, for the better Support and Government of the Poor within the said Town and Parish.

An Act for continuing, altering, amending, and making more effectual, an Act of Parliament made and passed in the Seventeenth and Eighteenth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, an Act for continuing and amending an Act passed in the Fifteenth and Sixteenth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, an Act for continuing an Act passed in the Seventh Year of the Reign of King George the Second, intituled, an Act for making more effectual an Act passed in the Third Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, intituled, an Act for repairing the Road leading from the City of Dublin to

the Town of Navan in the County of Meath; and for repairing the Road leading from the said Town of Navan to the Town of Nobber in the said County; and also for repairing the Road leading from the said Town of Navan to the Town of Kells in the said County.

An Act for amending and explaining the several Laws made in this Kingdom, for carrying on the Lagan Navigation.

An Act for empowering Grand Juries to present Bridges, and Tolls to be paid for passing the same in certain Cases.

An Act for amending and making more effectual an Act for repairing the Road leading from the Town of Nenagh in the County of Tipperary, through the Towns of Birr and Firbane in the King's County, to Curranoboy Bridge, on the Turnpike Road leading to Athlone in the County of Westmeath; and also for other Purposes therein mentioned.

An Act for altering, amending, and continuing, and making more effectual, an Act made in the Thirteenth and Fourteenth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, an Act for amending and repairing the Road leading from the City of Cork to the Brook which bounds the Counties of Cork and Tipperary, near the Foot of Kilworth Mountain, and on to Knockboy Turnpike Gate, and for other Purposes.

An Act for amending an Act made in the Thirteenth Year of His late Majesty George the Second, intituled, an Act for repairing and amending the Road leading from the Town of Clonmill in the County of Tipperary, through the Towns of Clogheen, Mitchelstown, and to Deneraile in the County of Cork; and an other Act passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His said late Majesty's Reign, intituled, an Act for amending and repairing the said Road, and for other Purposes.

An Act for making and keeping in Repair, a Road to lead from the Town of Nenagh in the County of Tipperary, to O'Briens Bridge in the County of Clare.

An Act for regulating the curing and preparing Provisions, and for preventing Combinations among the several Tradesmen and other Persons employed in making up such Provisions, and for regulating the Butter Trade in the City of Dublin, and for other Purposes therein mentioned.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 24th Day of September last, to prohibit the Transporting to any Parts out of this Kingdom, or Carrying Coastwise, any Plates of Copper, and Shipping and Lading any Plates of Copper on Board any Ship or Vessel, in order to the Transporting the same beyond the Seas, or Carrying the same Coastwise, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council; which Prohibition hath been since continued, and now subsists under certain Exceptions and Restrictions: And whereas an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, to empower His Majesty by Proclamation or Order in Council, for such Time as shall be therein expressed, to prohibit the Exporting, or Attempting to Export, out of this Kingdom, or the Carrying Coastwise in this Kingdom, any Sort of Copper in Sheets, or Copper in Bars, therein described, in such Manner, and under such Restraints, as His Majesty shall think fit: And His Majesty judging it necessary for the Publick Good, at this Critical Conjunction, to prohibit the Exporting of Copper out of this Kingdom, or Carrying Coastwise the same, His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, That no Person or Persons whatsoever do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Date hereof, presume to Export, or attempt to Export, out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwise, any Copper in Sheets, or under the Weight of Two Pounds and an Half to the Foot Superficial, unless under the Restraints herein after contained; or any other Copper, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council; but it is His Majesty's Pleasure, that the said Prohibition shall not be taken to extend to any Sort of Copper to be Exported or sent Coastwise for His Majesty's Service, by Order and under the Directions or Licence of the Commissioners of the Navy, nor to prevent the transporting or carrying Coastwise of any Sort of Copper (except Sheets of Copper of and under the Weight of Two and an Half Pounds to the Foot Superficial) without any Security being required; nor to the exporting the same to any Parts beyond the Sea, to which it may lawfully be exported (except to any of the Ports belonging to France or Spain) upon Condition that all such Copper as is intended for Exportation shall be inspected and examined by an Agent or Agents, appointed or to be appointed by the Commissioners of

His Majesty's Navy; and that a Certificate, under the Hand and Seal of the said Agent or Agents, shall be first had and obtained, setting forth, that no Part of the same consists of Plates of Copper, or Sheets of Copper (except as hereinafter excepted) or Nails made in Whole or in Part of Copper, which can be made Use of for the Purpose of sheathing and copping Ships or Vessels; which Certificate from the said Agent shall be delivered to the proper Officers of the Customs at the Port in which the said Copper is intended to be shipped, and shall be their Authority for allowing the Quantity of Copper specified in the said Certificate to be put on Board and exported.—And as touching Sheets of Copper of and under the Weight of Two Pounds and an Half to the Foot Superficial, His Majesty is further pleased to permit and allow the same to be carried Coastwise without any Restriction, provided that no greater Quantity than Ten Hundred Weight shall be laden on Board any one Ship, unless Security by Bond hath first been given to the proper Officers of the Customs, in Treble the Value of the Copper intended to be sent Coastwise, to carry the same to the Place proposed, and none other; and to produce and deliver a Certificate or Certificates, within Four Months from the Date of the Bond, from the proper Officers of the Customs at the Ports for which such Copper shall be entered and cleared out, of the same having been all duly landed at such Ports; which Certificate or Certificates such Officer is required to give, and the Commissioners of the Customs to transmit to the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in order to be laid before this Board: And His Majesty is likewise pleased to permit and allow the Exportation of Sheets of Copper of and under the Weight of Two Pounds and an Half to the Foot Superficial to any Parts beyond the Seas, to which the same may be lawfully exported (except to any of the Ports belonging to France or Spain,) upon Condition that no more than Ten Hundred Weight of such Copper shall be exported by any one Person or Partnership, and that the Quantity laden or put on Board any one Ship or Vessel, shall not exceed Three Tons in the whole; and also upon Condition that such Sheets of Copper shall be first inspected and examined by the Agent or Agents appointed or to be appointed by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy; and that a Certificate, under the Hand and Seal of such Agent or Agents shall be first had and obtained, setting forth, that such Sheets of Copper are of and under the Weight above described.—And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

**W**HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 10th of May last, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwise, Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire on the 23d of this instant August: And whereas it is judged expedient that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, except in those Cases where (for the Benefit and Advantage of Trade, and for the Use and Defence of Ships trading to Foreign Parts, and of the Transports and Victualling Vessels employed in His Majesty's Service) His Majesty, by His several Orders in Council of the 13th and 27th of October, and of the 6th and 22d of November, 1775, of the 5th and 19th of February, and the 23d of August and 25th of September, 1776, of the 16th of April, the 13th of August, and the 3d and 10th of October,

ber, 1777, of the 19th of June, the 7th and 26th of August, and the 10th of September, 1778, and of the 17th of May last, has thought proper to permit and allow the Exportation of, and carrying Coastwise, Gunpowder, Saltpetre, Arms and Ammunition, under certain Conditions and Restrictions mentioned in the said Orders: His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever (except the Master-General, Lieutenant-General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance, for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Three Months, to commence from the said 23d Day of this instant August, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwise, any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwise, except in the Cases comprized within the aforementioned Orders in Council, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and suffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the 29th Year of His late Majesty's Reign, entituled, "An Act to impower His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Saltpetre, and to enforce the Law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms and Ammunition; and also to impower His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwise of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition."—And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
