Admiralty-Office, September 5, 1780. Extract of a Letter from Admiral Sir George Bridges Rodney, Bart to Mr. Stephens, dated Prince Royal, St. Lucia, July 1, 1780.

INCE my Dispatches of Yesterday by the Action, Captain Keeler, I must desire you will acquaint their Lordships, that Three of the Spanish Ships of the Line are gone to Leeward with their Convoy, and were seen to pass the Island of Santa Cruz, steering to the Westward.

Had the Spanish Admiral repaired instantly to the Rendezvous he gave his Fleet, we certainly had brought him to Action before his Junction with the French; but he chose to go no further than Guadaloupe, and from thence detached a Frigate to Martinique, demanding a Junction of the French Fleet off that Island. Monf. De Guichen immediately failed with Eighteen Ships of the Line to Leeward of the Islands, and joined the Spaniards under Dominique.

I wait impatiently for the Junction of Mr. Wal-fingham's Squadron, which Captain Robinson, of the Shrewsbury, informs me I may expect in a few Days. When that happy Event takes Place, the Numbers of the Enemy shall not prevent my looking them in the Face, and attacking them, should they give me a proper Opportunity.
