W HEREAS His Majefty was pleafed, by His Order in Council of the 24th Day of September laft, to prohibit the Transporting to any Parts out of this Kingdom, or Carrying Coaltwife, any Plates of Copper, and Shipping and Lading any Plates of Copper on Board any Ship of Veffel, in order to the Transporting the fame beyond the Seas; or Carrying the fame Coaftwile, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council; which Prohibition hath been fince continued; and now fubfits under certain Exceptions and Refrictions: And whereas an Act palled in the laft Seffion of Parliament, to impower His Majefty. by Proclamation or Order in Council, for fuch Time as fhall be therein expressed, to prohibit the Exporting, or Attempting to Export, out of this Kingdom, or the Carrying Coaffwife in this Kingdom, any Sort of Copper in Sheets, or this Kingdom, any Sort of Copper in Sheets, or Copper in Bars, therein defcribed, in fuch Manner, and under fuch Reffraints; as His Majefty fhall think fit: And His Majefty judging it neceffary for the Publick Good, at this Critical Conjuncture, to prohibit the Exporting of Copper out of this King-dom, or Carrying Coaftwife the fame, His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command. That no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, That no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Date hereof, prefume to Ex-port, or attempt to Export, out of this Kingdom, or carry Coali-Mile; any Copper in Sheets, of or under the Weight of Two Pounds and an Half to the Foot Superficial, unless under the Reftraints herein after contained; of any other Copper; with-out Leave or Permiflion in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefly or His Privy Council; but it is His Majefly's Pleafure; that the faid Prohibit; on fhall not be taken to extend to any Sort of Cop per fiall not be taken to extend to any Sort of Cop per to be Exported or fent Coaffwife for His Majefty's Service, by Order and under the Directions or Licence of the Commissioners of the Navy, nor to prevent the transporting or carrying Coaltwile of any Sort of Copper (except Sheets of Copper of and under the Weight of Two and an Half Pounds to the Foot Superficial) without any Security being required; nor to the exporting the fame to any Parts beyond the Sea, to which it may lawfully be ex-ported (except to any of the Ports belonging to France or Spain) upon Condition that all fuch Cop-per as is intended for Exportation that be inper as is meended for Exportation mail de in-fpected and examined by an Agent of Agents, ap-pointed or to be appointed by the Commissioners of His Majelky's Navy; and that a Certificate, under the Hand and Seal of the faid Agent of Agents, shall be first had and obtained, ferting forth, that no Part of the fame confilts of Plates of Copper, or Shrets of Copper forces as Heatingforth and a Sheets of Copper (except as hereinafter excepted) of Näils måde in Whole or in Part of Copper, which Ean be maile Ufe of for the Purpofe of fheathing and coppering Ships or Veffels, which Certificate from the faid Agent shall be delivered to the proper Officers of the Cultoms at the Port in which the

AT the Court at St. James's, the 18th of August, 1780, PRESENT, The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. Copper of and under the Weight of Two Pounds and an Half to the Foot Superficial, His Majelfy is further pleafed to permit and allow the fame to be carried Coaftwife without any Reflriction, provided that no greater Quantity than Ten Hundred Weight fliall be laden on Board any one Ship, unleis Security by Bond hath first been given to the proper Officers of the Customs, in Ire-ble the Value of the Copper intended to be fent Coaffwile, to carry the fame to the Place propofed, and none other; and to produce and deliver a Cer-tificate or Certificates; within Four Months from the Date of the Bond, from the proper Officers of the Cultoms at the Ports for which fuch Copper shall be entered and cleared out, of the fame having been all duly landed at fuch Ports; which Cer-tificate or Certificates fuch Officer is required to give; and the Commissioners of the Cuf-toms to trainfinit to the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury, in order to be laid hefore this Board: And His Majefty is likewife pleafed to permit and allow the Exportation of Sheets of Copper of and under the Weight of Two Pounds and an Half to the Foot Superficial to any Parts be-yond the Seas, to which the fame may be lawfully yond the seas, to which the lame may be lawruny exported (except to any of the Ports belonging to France or Spain.) upon Condition that no more than Ten Hundred Weight of fuch. Copper shall be ex-ported by any one Perfon or Parmership; and that the Quantity laden or put on Board any one Ship or the Quantity laden or put on Board any one Ship or Veffel, shall not exceed Three Tons in the whole; and alfo upon Condition that fuch Sheets of Copper shall be first inspected and examined by the Agent or Agents appointed or to be appointed by the Com-millioners of His Majefty's Navy; and that a Cer-tificate; under the Hand and Seal of fuch Agent or Agents shall be first had and obtained, fetting forth; that fuch Sheets of Copper are of and under the Weight above deferibed. And the Right Honour-able the Lords Commifficients of His Majefty's Treafury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
