We have Letters from Luxemburg of the 2d instant, by which we are told, that the Baron de Mercy being fent with 3000 Horfe to guard 2 Convoy of Provisions from Sarbruc, he was the 30 past attacked in his Rear near Koningsmackeren by 5000 French Horse commanded by the Sieur de la Haye Lieutenant-General, who succeeded so far in his attempt, as to take some of the Wagons that were in the Rear; but that Baron Mercy turning head upon the Enemy, killed two hundred of them, together with the faid Lieutenant General, forced the relt to retire, and carryed his Convoy fafe to the Army. The Letters add, that the Duke of Lorrain had made a Battery on the Moscelle, at a place called Raggi, where he had planted four pieces of Cannon, to guard a Ford in that River; that Mareschal Crequi was encamped in fight of the Imperial Army on the other side the Mefelle; that the Front of the French Army reached from Magiers to Richemout, and that the had made a Bridge over the Mofelle about a Mu ker shot from Thionville. It is farther faid, that Mareschal Grequi had detached 3000 men towards Alface to join the Steur de Monclar, who it feems is not strong enough to make head against the Army of the Circles, commanded by the Duke of same Eyfenach.
