Custom-House, London, Sept. 30, 1780. W Hereas, on Friday the 25th of August last, about One of the Clock in the Morning, Five Persons unknown, armed with Clubs and other offenfive Weapons, came to the House of John Bursey, late a Riding Officer of the Customs, at Milton in the County of Southampton, and, under Pretence of giving the said Bursey an Information, whereby he might make Seizure of some uncustomed Goods, prevailed on him to get up, (the said Bursey being then in Bed) and to come down and open his Door; that they thereupon immediately rushed in upon him, and with the said Clubs and other Weapons beat and ireated him so unmercifully, by giving him several dangerous Wounds on the Head and other Parts of his Body, that he languished till the 27th, and then died; and the Coroner's Inquest having lat on the Body, have brought in their Verdict Wilful Murder against the said Five Persons unknown.
