of about Nine Pounds in Money, and Two Wutches: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the Said Robbery, is hereby pleased to promise His most Gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Persons who actually discharged the said Pistols) who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices therein, fo that he or they may be apprehended and convicted theriof.
