WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, that on Tuesday the 17th of October instant, about Ten o'Clock at Night, Mr. John Farmer, Mr. Daniel Slade, and Mr. James Ferguson, were stopped in a Post Chaise on the Highway near Birch Wood, within Three Miles of Farningham, in Kent, by Seven Footpads, dressed as Soldiers, in White Jackets, turned up with Yellow, and armed with Pistols and Hangers, who, after firing at the Post-boy, and discharging Two Pistols into the Chaise, robbed them of about Nine Pounds in Money, and Two Watches: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Robbery, is hereby pleased to promise His most Gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Persons who actually discharged the said Pistols) who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
