*Naples, June 8.* This week several solemn Processions have been made by order of our Archbishop, to implore the Divine Benediction upon our Kings Arms. The two Gallies which transported 300. men to *Porto Ercole,* are returned higher; and a Galliot of *Lipari,* hath lately taken a Felucca of *Messina,* manned with 20 men. We have an account, that the 12 Gallies which sailed from *Messina,* the last month, returned thither again the first instant; and having taken fresh Forces on board, sailed again, with design, as is said, to go and besiege *Catanea,* whither several Troops are likewise marched by Land.

*Venice, June 18.* The great fears we had of the Turkish Fleet, which was said to consist in above 100 sail, come to nothing, for we are now assured, that there are only 18 Turkish Gallies with some Men of War aboard, bound for *Tripoli,* whither they carry a new Bassa. From *Constantinople* they write, that the Grand Signior had resolved to fix his residence there; and that he had sent to the Czar of *Moscow* to demand the surrender of that part of the *Ukraine* lately possessed by *Dorofensko,* which if refused, War would immediately be declared.

*Ditto, June 23.* The affairs of the Spaniards in *Sicily,*
