 EDNESDAY last, being the Anniversary of the King's Accession to the Throne, who entered into the Twenty-first Year of His Reign, there was a numerous and splendid Appearance of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction, to compliment His Majesty upon the Occasion. At One o'Clock the Guns in the Park and at the Tower were fired; and in the Evening there were Illuminations, and other Public Demonstrations of Joy, in London and Westminster.

This is to give Notice, that his Royal Highness the young Prince is to be Christened in the Great Council-Chamber at St. James's Palace, on Tuesday next, the 31st Instant, about Seven o'Clock in the Evening; and that all Peers and Peeres'ses, Privy Counsellors and their Wives, Foreign Ministers and their Wives, who purpose to attend at the Ceremony, are to assemble in the Queen's Presence-Chamber and Drawing Room in the said Palace, between the Hours of Six and Seven the same Evening.

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, that on Tuesday the 17th of October instant, about Ten o'Clock at Night, Mr. John Farmer, Mr. Daniel Slade, and Mr. James Ferguson, were stopped in a Post Chaise on the Highway near Birch Wood, within Three Miles of Farningham, in Kent, by Seven Footpads, dressed as Soldiers, in White Jackets, turned up with Yellow, and armed with Pistols and Hangers, who, after firing at the Post-boy, and discharging Two Pistols into the Chaise, robbed them of about Nine Pounds in Money, and Two Watches: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Robbery, is hereby pleased to promise His most Gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Persons who actually discharged the said Pistols) who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
