Westminster, October 31.

THIS Day the Parliament met; His Majesty went to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes seated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Sir Francis Molyneux, Knt. Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers; the Commons being come thither, His Majesty signified His Pleasure to them by the Lord High Chancellor, that they should return to their House and chuse their Speaker, and present him to His Majesty for His Royal Approbation Tomorrow at Two o'Clock. They returned accordingly, and chose Charles Wolfran Cornwall, Esq; to be their Speaker.

Petersburgh, October 3. Sunday being the Birthday of his Imperial Highness the Great Duke, he received the Compliments of the Foreign Ministers and Nobility in the Morning, and in the Evening there was a Ball at the Palace; and this Day, being the Anniversary of her Imperial Majesty's Coronation, the Court will be in Gala, and the Town illuminated.

Dublin Castle, October 23, 1780.

This Day being the Anniversary of the Irish Rebellion in 1641, his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant proceeded in State to Christ-Church, attended by several of the Nobility, and escorted by a Squadron of Horse. After his Excellency's Return to the Castle, the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired Three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks: And at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations and other Rejoicings throughout the City.

St. James's, October 21, 1780.

Navy Office, October 12, 1780.

THE Principal Officers and Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy do hereby give Notice, that they are ready to treat for Ships of 200 Tons and upwards, so serve as Transports and Victuallers. To be manned in the Proportion of five Men and a Boy to every 100 Tons Measurement, and furnished with three Cables of 120 Fathoms each.
