P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Whereas the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 18th of August last, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwise, Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire on the 23d of this instant November: And whereas it is judged expedient that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, except in those Cases where (for the Benefit and Advantage of Trade, and for the Use and Defence of Ships trading to Foreign Parts, and of the Transports and Vissualling Vessels employed in His Majesty's Service) His Majesty, by His several Orders in Council of the 13th and 27th of October, and of the 6th and 22d of November, 1775, of the 5th and 19th of February, and the 23d of August and 25th of September, 1776, of the 16th of April, the 13th of August, and the 3d and 10th of October, 1777, of the 19th of June, the 7th and 26th of August, and the 10th of September, 1778, and of the 17th of May last, has thought proper to permit and allow the Exportation of, and carrying Coastwise, Gunpowder, Saltpetre, Arms and Ammunition, under certain Conditions and Restrictions mentioned in the said Orders: His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever (except the Master-General, Lieutenant-General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance, for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Three Months, to commence from the said 23d Day of this instant November, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwise, any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwise, except in the Cases comprized within the aforementioned Orders in Council, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and suffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the 29th Year of His late Majesty's Reign, entituled, "An Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Saltpetre, and to enforce the Law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms and Ammunition; and also to empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwise of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition." — And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, that on Sunday the 15th Day of October last, the Dwelling-house of Mr. Thomas Dickins, Innholder, at Rainham in the County of Norfolk, was forcibly entered by about Fourteen Men, supposed to be Smugglers, who broke open every Door therein which they found locked, and swore they would take whatever Money they could find in the House, and that they would murder the said Mr. Dickins, whom they searched for with that Intent, but not meeting with him, they departed, swearing that they would murder him the first Opportunity:

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in entering the said House, breaking open the Doors, and the other daring and outrageous Proceedings above-mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most Gracious Pardon to any one of them, who will discover his Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a farther Encouragement, His Majesty is hereby pleased to offer a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS to any Person who shall apprehend, or cause to be apprehended, any one or more of the Persons concerned in the Offences above-mentioned, to be paid by the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury upon the Conviction of any one or more of the said Offenders.

Navy-Office, November 17, 1780.

THE Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having appointed Money for paying Half-Pay to Sea Officers, from the 1st Day of January, to the 30th of June, 1780, according to His Majesty's Establishment in that Behalf; These are to give Notice, that the said Payments will begin to be made at the Pay-Office of the Treasurer of the Navy in Broad-Street, on Monday the 27th and Tuesday the 28th Instant, at Ten of the Clock in the Morning, viz. To Captains and their Attorneys, and other Officers appearing themselves, on Monday; and to Attorneys of Lieutenants, Masters and Surgeons, on Tuesday, (after which the List will be recalled once a Month) that all Persons may then and there attend to receive what may become payable unto them, and not only bring with them the Affidavit required touching their not having enjoyed the Benefit of any Publick Employment, either at Sea or on Shore, during the Time they are to be paid their Half-Pay; but also produce Certificates that they have subscribed to the Test, and

taken the Oaths required by Act of Parliament to His present Majesty; and in Case any of the said Sea Officers shall not be able to attend themselves to receive their Money, but employ Attorneys for that Purpose, that the said Attorneys may produce the like Certificates and Affidavits from the Persons they are employed by.

Navy-Office, October 12, 1780.

THE Principal Officers and Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy do hereby give Notice, that they are ready to treat for Ships of 200 Tons and upwards, to serve as Transports and Victuallers. To be manned in the Proportion of five Men and a Boy to every 100 Tons Measurement, and furnished with three Cables of 120 Fathoms each. Ships now at the Out-Ports in the English Channel will be allowed a certain Number of Days Pay for coming to a King's Yard, if they sail from the Port where they are by a certain Day, (which will be ascertained at the Treaty) and they are found fit for the Service; which Allowance may be known by applying at the Clerk of the Admiralty Office in this Office.

Those at Bristol and Liverpool will be surveyed, measured and valued by the Overseers of the King's Ships building at those Ports, in the best Manner they can, subject to a Resurvey, Measurement and Valuation at the first King's Port they arrive at; and if found proper Ships will enter into Pay the Day they sail from those Ports for Cork or Plymouth, to which Places they are to proceed at the Risque of the Owners, if taken or destroyed by the Enemy; but from their Arrival at either of those Ports to be at the Risque of Government from the Enemy.
