AT the Court at St. James's, the 15th of November, 1780,

ESENT. R The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council! Hereas the Time limited by His Majefty's W Order in Council of the 18th of August last, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this Kingdom, of carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder, Salt, petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire on the 23d of this instant November: And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Pro-hibition should be continued for fome Time hibition thould be continued for fome Time longer, except in those Cafes where (for the Be-nefit and Advantage of Trade, and for the Use and Defence of Ships trading to Foreign Parts, and of the Transports and Victualling Veffels employed in His Majefly's Service) His Majefly, by His feveral Orders in Council of the 13th and 27th of October, and of the 6th and 22d of November, 1775, of the 5th and 19th of September, 1776, of the 16th of April, the 13th of August, and the 3d and 10th of Octo-ber, 1777, of the 19th of September, 1778, and of the 17th of May laft, has thought proper to permit and allow the Ex-portation of; and carrying Coaftwife, Gunpow-der, Saltpetre, Arms and Ammunition, under certain Conditions aed Restrictions mentioned in the faid Orders : His Majefty doth therefore, by the faid Orders : His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, here-by order, require; prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever (except the Mafter-General, Lieutenant-General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance, for His Majefly's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Three Months, to commence from the faid 23d Day of this Inftant November, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaftwife, any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gun-powder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Veffel, in order munition, on Board any Ship or venet, in order to transporting the fame beyond the Seas, or carry-ing the fame Coastwife, except in the Cases com-prized within the aforementioned Orders in Council, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Aft nassed in the zoth Vear of inflicted by an Aêt passed in the 29th Year of His late Majetty's Reign, entituled, "An Act "to impower His Majesty to prohibit the Ex-"portation of Saltpetre, and to enforce the Law "for empowering His Majefty to prohibit the "Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of "Arms and Ammunition; and alfo to impower "His Majefly to reftrain the carrying Coaffwife of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition."—And the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treasury, the Commif-fioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Ad-miral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Mafter-General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
