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Nefina, fure 12.

TH E expeted Convoy arrived here yefterday ftomFrance, confiling in io Men of War, and a grear number of othet Velfels laden with Soldiers anu Provifions; the Soldiers they put afhore were 2500 Fuot, and 400 Horfe. Here are now in Port 22 Men of War commanded by the sieur du Ruefne. It is thought the Duke de vivonne will fuddenly yndertake fome ation by Land, ber ing titonger than the Spaniards.

Genoua, fune 19. Yefterday arrived here a Veffel, the Malter fays he mee'near the Inland of Corffca fix Spanilh Men of War, and three orher Veffels taden with Soldiers, bound for sicily, which, it's b.lieved, are shofe fhips that failed from Barcelona, u. boatd of which is the Duke of Bourtuonville, who is to command the Spanifh Forces in Sicily.

Ditto, fune 30 . The 26 inflant arrived tere the Daniel and Mo omas, Xxicholds Chotpoel Mafter fromEngLand, and the Charles, Devid Reddy Commander from Mcefina; by the later we have advice, that the Spaniards had cut off a parry of 900 French, which were marching towards Catanea, which place, it'sfaid, the French intend to befiege by Sea and Land, Yefterday came in the Italian Merchant, George Phenny from Alicant, and the $\mathcal{F o f e p h}$ Bonadventare, Fobn Budy $f_{o n}$ Mafer, from Palermo, where were ri Spaniftrmen of War unrigged and ungunned, and 16 Gallies. The 12 French Gallies continue fillar Civita Vc cckia.

Venice, fune 26. The 'pan':h Ambaffador the Marquis de Fuentes, is preparing for his deparcure, and at the fame time a Palace is provided for bi, Succeffor the Marguis de Villa Garcia. From Coxfantinople. unr advices fay, that the GrandVifier was very much difpofed to accommodate matters wich the Mokovites, provided they would reffore fome of the places they had taken in the Uleraine; that the Grand Signior wasat Confanm zinople, and purpofed to concinue there for the fusure.

Vienna, fune ${ }_{3} 0$.Our lan Letiers from Poiand faid, that the in of the next mionth many Troops, which had been in che fervice of that Crown, would be difbanded, of which the Couse Shaftgotz Governor of sileffa will endeavor to draw as many as he can into the Emperors fervice. Count Lefie is arrivad here, but will not make any long fay, being appoinred by the Emperor to command the Troops which he fenda to the sfiftance of the King of Denmurk. This week arrived here z Courier from the Imperial Army, with Letters from the Duke of Lorrain, in which, as is reported, his Highnefs complains that he has not been able to execute his defefigns, for that the Confederates in Flanders have notgiven the Enemy that diverfion which he expeted ffom them, which was neceffary for the enabling him to make good the refolutions that had been taken as to his aeting with the Imperial Army.
Copeabzgen, Эuly 6. This morning we receive an account from Schonen, that the laft night a general Affult was made upon (ratmoe, which proved unfuccefs-
ful, for although the Aflailants made the Artack whith great vigor, and that fome of them made their way to the Walls of the Town, yet they were repulfed with the lofs of 12 or $\$ 500$ men, as the general report fyys, though fome do not allow the number of the flain to be fo great, among which are feveral perfons of quality, and Officers of note, and among others the Duke de Croye and Major General Bibau are mortally wounded. We expect with great impatience the arrival of the Dutch Squatron of Men of War under the command of Lieutenant-Admiral rromp, forthat the Suedes Fleer is abruad much flronger than ours, which is notwithftanding likewile gune to Sea ; and chis cay we have advice, that the two Fleers were very near each other. Paffengers arrived here in fevenedays from Normay, fay, that the Sieur Guldenlieu bas pofeffed himfelf of reveral confiderable Paffes, and thar he was marching with a Body of an Army towards Gittenburg.
Ham'urg, fuly 9. From Rosiock they write, that a fmall Veffel was arrived there from Gotl.nd, which ha filled two days in company of the Suedes Fleer, taking their courfe to ards the sound, confilting in 28 Men of War, 5 Fireflips, and a great number of fmall Veffels. The Elector of Brandenburg has held a genefal review of his Armv, and we expect the next news we have will be, that he is fer down before stetin. The Letrers from Dexmark fpeak of a great lofs suftained by the Dines in an Afgualt they made upon Malmoc, in which they were repulfed.

Strasburg, fuly 5. The 3 d inflant the Troops of the Circles under the command of the Duke of Suxe Ey fenach, advanced to Colmar, were they lay fitll yelterday, and this day were to march again towards Enffifoym in Surd ${ }_{6} \circ \mathrm{w}$, and to morrow the Duke of saxe as weare informed, purpofes to be at Nieubure above Bri $j_{d} c$, where he will lay a Bridge over the Rhine. The Sicur de Monclar is in the meantime pofled with his Troops under the Walls of Brifag.
Triey, July 7. The Imperial Army continues encamped at Enmery, and the French Army over againit it on the other fide of the Mofelle. The 3 dinflant another great Convoy went hence to the Imperial Army, under the command of the Commiffary General $C_{a p-}$ lieres, and the Marquis de Bareith. We do not expect the Duke of Lorrain will enter upon any farther attion till the Confederaces be able to give the French a diverfion in Flandess.

On Monday laft Lieutenant. $\mathrm{G}_{\mathrm{e}}=$ netal Chauvet ppfled the Rhine at Bochumb below Keyferwort with four Regiments of Horfe, and three Companies of Dragoons, and the nexr day Colonel Mellinger followed with two Regimenss of Horfe and five Companies of Dragoons more.
