The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS, by an Act of Parliament paffed in the Twenty fixth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled,

"An Act to oblige Ships more ef-"fectually to perform their Quarantine; and for the better preventing the Plague being brought from Foreign Parts into Great Britain " or Ireland, or the Ifles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Al-" derney, Sark or Man;" it is, among many other Things, enacted, That all Ships and Vessels arriving, and all Persons, Goods, and Merchandizes whatfoever, coming or imported into any Port or Place within Great Britain or Ireland, or any of the Ifles aforementioned, from any Place from whence His Majefly, His Heirs or Succeffors, by and with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council, shall judge it probable that the Infection may be brought, shall be obliged to make their Quarantine in such Place and Places, for such Time and in such Manner as has been, or shall from Time to Time be, directed by His Majesty, His Heirs or Successors, by His or Their Order or Orders, made in His or Their Privy Council, and notified by Proclamation, or published in the London Gazette ; and that until fuch Ships, Veffels, Perfons, Goods and Merchandizes shall have refpectively performed and be difcharged from fuch Quarantine, no fuch Perfon, Goods, or Merchan dizes, or any of them, shall come or be brought on Shore, or go or be put on Board any other Ship or Veffel, in any Place within His Majefly's Dominions, unlefs in fuch Manner and in fuch Cafes, and by fuch Licence, as shall be directed or permitted by such Order or Orders made by His Majesty, His Heirs or Successors, in Council as aforesaid; and that all fuch Ships and Veffels, and the Perfons or Goods coming or imported in, or going or being put on Board the fame; and all Ships, Veffels, Boats and Perfons receiving any Goods or Perfons out of the fame, shall be subject to such Orders, Rules and Directions concerning Quarantine, and the Prevention of Infection, as have been or fhall be made by His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, in Council, and notified by Proclamation, or published in the London Gazette as aforementioned, under fuch Pains and Penalties as are inflicted by the faid A&. And whereas information hath been received that the Plague hath manifested itself in many Places of the Ukraine and Wolhynia, and that the Contagion thereof fpreads further every Day; and His Majefty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth thereupon judge it probable, that the Infection may be brought into this Kingdom from

That the Places herein after named shall be and are hereby appointed to be the Places, wherein fuch Ships or Veffels (not having the Infection on Board) shall respectively perform Quarantine; that is to fay, All such Ships or Vessels which are or shall be bound to the Port of London, or any Member, Creek, of other Parts thereof, or to the River Thames, of Medway, fhall perform their Quarantine in Stand-gate Creek. All fuch Ships or Veffels which are or fhall be bound to the Ports of Ipfwich, Yarmouth, Lynn, Bofton, Hull, Newcastle, or Berwick upon Tweed, or any of them, or any Member or Creeks thereof, or other Place therein, shall perform their Quarantine in Whitebooth Road between Hall and. Grimfby. All fuch Ships or Veffels which are or fhall be bound to the Ports of Carlifle and Chefter, or either of them, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, or to any Part of the Isle of Man, shall perform their Quarantine in a Place called Highlake, near Liverpool, at the West End thereof. All such Ships or Vessels which are or fhall be bound to the Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucefler, Briftol, Bridgwater, or any of them, or any Member or Creek of them, or any of them, or to Padflow or St. Ives, being Members of the Port of Plymouth, or to Ilfracomb or Barnflaple, being Members of the Port of Exeter, or to any other Place within the faid Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucester, Bristol, or Bridgwater, or within the faid Members or Creeks, shall perform their Quarantine in Kingroad and Porshute Pill. All such Ships or Veffels which are or shall be bound to the Port of Plymouth, except fuch Parts thereof as have been herein before mentioned, and also except Falmouth, one Member thereof, or to the Port of Exeter, except fach Parts thereof as have been herein before mentioned, or to the Port of Pool, or any of the Members or Creeks, or other Places within the faid Ports of Plymouth, Exeter, and Pool, except as before excepted, shall perform their Quarantine in some Place between Woodend and Saltafa.

Saltash in the River Tamer: All fuch Ships or Veffels as are or shall be bound to Falmouth, a Member of the Port of Plymouth, or any Creek thereof, or any other Place therein, shall perform their Qua-rantine in a Place called St. Ives Pool, within the Mouth of the Harbour of Falmouth. And all fuch Ships or Vessels as are or shall be bound to the Ports of Southampton, Chichefter, Sandwich, or any of them, or any of the Members or Creeks thereof, or of any of them, or any other Place within the fame, shall perform their Quarantine at a Place called the Mother Bank near Portfmouth. And all fuch Ships or Vessels as are or shall be bound to the Eastern Coast of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Leith, Borrowstoness, Alloa, Dunbar, Kirkaldy, Anstruther, Preston Pans, Dundee, Perth, Montrole, and Aberdeen, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, shall perform their Quarantine in Inverkeithing Bay. And all fuch Ships and Veffels as are or shall be bound to the Western Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Port Glafgow, Greenock, Irvine, Campbeltoun, Oban, Rothfay, Fort William, Air, Port Patrick, Stranraer, and Wigtown, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, shall perform their Quarantine at Lamlash in the Island of Arran. And all fuch Ships or Veffels as are or fhall be bound to the Northern Ports of Scotland, ' comprehending the Ports of Invernels, Zetland, Orkney, Caithnefs, and Stornaway, or to any Member, Creek or other Parts thereof, fhall per-form their Quarantine in Cromarty Bay in the Murray Frith. And all fuch Ships or Veffels as are or shall be bound to the South weit Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Dumfries and Kirkcudbright, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, shall perform their Quarantine at Carsthorn at the Month of the River Nith. And all fuch Ships or Veffels which are or shall be bound to the life of Jerfey; or any Part thereof, fhall perform their Quarantine at a certain Place on the Cuaft of the faid Island called Belle Croute, or at some Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coalt of England. And all fuch Ships or Veffels as shall be bound to the Islands of Guernsey, Sark or Alderney, or either of them, or any Part of them, or any of them, shall perform their Quarantine in a Place near the Island of Guernsey, called the Little Road, of at fome Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coaft of England. That no Pilot shall go on Board any Ship or Vef-fel obliged to perform Quarantine, in order to conduct the fame into any Port or Place, but fhall per-form fuch Service in fome other Boat or Veffel, which Boat or Veffel shall keep as much to the Windward of the Ship or Vessel, fo to be conducted, as possible; and if any Pilot or other Perfon shall go on Board fuch Ship or Veffel, fuch Pilot or other Perfon shall perform Quarantine, in like Manner as any Perfon coming in fuch Ship or Veffel shall be

obliged to perform the fame. That all Goods, Wares. and Merchandizes, liable to Quarantine as aforefaid, fhall be opened, unpacked, and aired, unlefs His Majefty fhall think fit, by His Order in Council, to direct otherwife, and fo remain a Week; other than Hemp and Flax, Paper or Books, Silk Raw, Thrown, or Wrought, Linnen, Cotton Wool, Cotton Yarn or manufactured, Wool Raw or any wife Wrought, Feathers, Grograin or Mohair Yarn, Human Hair, Goats Hair, Carmenia Wool, Carpets, Camblets, Burdets, or other Manufactures of Silk and Cotton, Kid Skins, and Skins in the Wool or Hair, Spunges, Wine and Oil

in Chefts, Thread Stockings, all Goods packed with Straw or Cotton, Straw Hats, and Brufhes, Matting, and Artificial Flowers; which Goods and Merchandizes, fo as aforefaid enumerated, are to be opened, unpacked, and aired, unlefs His Majefty thall think fit, by His Order in Council, to direct otherwife, and fo remain for the Space of a Fortnight.

fo remain for the Space of a Fortnight. That all Goods imported by fuch Ships and Veffels refpectively shall be aired in the following Places, that is to fay : All fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Port of London, or any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, or to the River Thames, or Medway, shall be aired in Standgate Creek. All fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Ports of Ipswich, Yarmouth, Lynn, Bofton, Hull, Newcaftle, or Ber-wick upon Tweed, or any of them, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, shall be aired in Whitebooth Road, between Hull and Grimfby. All fuch Goods as fhall be imported to the Ports of Carlifle and Chefter, or either of them, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, or to any Part of the Ifle of Man, shall be aired in a Place called Highlake, near Liverpool, at the Weft End thereof: All fach Goods as fhall be imported to the Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucester, Bristol, Bridgwater, or any of them, or any Member or Creek of them, or any of them, or to Padflow or St. Ives, being Members of the Port of Plymouth, or to Ilfracomb or Barntlaple, being Members of the Port of Exeter, or to any other Place within the faid Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucester, Bristol, or Bridg-water, or within the faid Members or Creeks, shall be aired in Kingroad, and Porfhute Pill. All fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Port of Plymouth, except fuch Parts thereof as have been herein before mentioned, and also except Falmouth, one Member thereof, or to the Port of Exeter, except fuch Parts thereof as have been herein before mentioned, or to the Port of Pool, or any of the Members or Creeks, or other Places within the faid Ports of Plymouth, Exeter and Pool, except as before excepted, shall be aired in forme Place between Wood end and Saltash in the River Tamer. All fuch Goods as shall be imported to Falmouth, a Member of the Port of Plymouth, or any Creek thereof, or any other Place therein; fhall be aired in a Place called St. Ives Pool, within the Mouth of the Harbour of Falmouth. All fuch Goods as thail be imported to the Ports of Southampton, Chicheller, Sandwich, or any of them, or any of the Members or Creeks thereof, or of any them, or any other Place within the fame, shall be aired at a Place called the Mother Bank near Portfmouch. And all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Eaflern Coaft of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Leith, Borrowftonefs, Alloa, Dunbar, Kir-kaldy, Anflruther, Prefton Pans, Dundee, Perth, Montrofe, and Aberdeen, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, shall be aired in Inverkeithing Bay. And all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Wellern Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Port Glafgow, Greenock, Irvine, Campbeltoun, Oban, Rothfay, Fort William, Air, Port Patrick, Stransaer, and Wigtown, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, shall be aired at Lamlash in the Ifland of Arran. And all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Northern Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Inverness, Zetland, Orkney, Caithnels, and Stornaway, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, fhall be aired in Cromarty Bay in the Murray Frith. And all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the South-Well Ports of Scot, land, comprehending the Ports of Dumfries and Kirkçudbright,

Kirkcudbright, or to any Member, Creek or other Parts thereof, shall be aired at Carsthorn, at the Mouth of the River Nith. And all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Isle of Jersey, or any Part thereof, shall be aired at a certain Place on the Coast of the faid Ifland called Belle Croute, or at fuch Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coaft of England, where the Ships, in which fuch Goods are imported, shall repectively perform their Quarantine. And all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Islands of Guernfey, Sark, or Alderney, or either of them, or any Part of them, or any of them, fhall be aired in a Place near the Ifland of Guernfey, called the Little Road, or at fuch Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coast of England, where the Ships, in which fuch Goods are im-ported, shall respectively perform their Quarantine. That whatfoever Ship or Perfon shall receive any Men or Goods from on Board any Ship or Vessel under Quarantine, shall be compelled to perform the like Quarantine. That fuch Perfons as, after Quaran-tine performed, shall be employed in the Hold of any Ship or Vessel, for the taking any Goods not liable to retain Infection from the Goods and Merchandizes before enumerated, mall be obliged to perform a new Quarantine. That the Captains of every of His Majefly's Ships of War, who fhall meet any fuch Ship or Veffel coming to any of the Ports of Great Britain or Ireland, or of the Ifles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark or Man, fhall take due Care to prevent the Landing any Goods, Seamen or Passengers from on Board the fame, until they shall be put under the Direction of the Officers of His Majefty's Cufforns.

That the Committioners and other Officers of His Majefty's Cultoms do use their utmost Diligence and Care, that the Quarantine before directed be duly performed.

That the Commanders of His Majefly's Ships of War, as likewife the Commanders of His Majefly's Ports and Garrifons lying near the Sea Coafts, and all the Juffices of the Peace, Mayors, Sheriffs, Bai-Jiffs, Chief Magiftrates, Conftables, Headboroughs, Tything Men, and all other Officers and Minifters of Juffice, be aiding and affifting to the faid Officers of His Majefly's Cultoms, and to all others that fhall be concerned in ftopping all fuch Ships as aforefaid, and in bringing them to their Places appointed for the Performance of their Quarantine, and in due Performance thereof.

And the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefly's Treafury, the Commiffioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Mafter-General and the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majefly's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders, in Chief for the Time theing of the faid respective Ifles of Jerfey, Guernsfey, Alderney, Sark and Man, are to give the neceflary Directions herein, as to them may respectiveily appertain.

W HEREAS it has been reprefented unto His Mojefty, that great Inconveniences have grifen, by Appeals in Prize Caufes not being profe-

cuted in a reasonable Time, and from Secret Appeals, or Protocols of Appeals, being entered before a Notary Publick, without any Notice given to the Court or Parties appellate, or their Proctors : For Remedy whereof, His Majefty hath thought fit, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order and direct, that every Perfon being a Party in a Prize Caufe in the High Court of Admiralty of England, or in any Vice Admiralty Court, and against whom a Sentence shall hereafter be given, or an Interlocutory Decree pronounced, and who shall appeal therefrom within Fourteen Days, shall profecute fuch his Appeal, by taking out the ufual Inhi-bition within Three Months after the Time fuch Sentence or Interlocutory Decree shall be given, if fuch Sentence or Decree shall be given in the High Court of Admiralty, and within Nine Months, if fuch Sentence or Decree shall be given in any of the Vice-Admiralty-Courts; and that after the Ex-piration of the faid Terms of Three Months and Nine Month's respectively limited as aforefaid, without any Inhibition having been taken out, no Appeal shall be allowed to be profecuted by any Personsbeing a Party in the faid High Court of Admiralty, or Vice-Admiralty Courts, nor fhall any Inhii ition be granted at the Prayer of fuch Perfon, or his Proctor, but the faid Sentence or Interlocutory Decree shall stand confirmed as to fuch Perfon. And that in all Cafes where a Sentence shall be given, or In-terlocutory Decree shall be pronounced in the High Court of Admiralty, or in any of His Majesty's. Vice-Admiralty Courts, any Perfon not being a. Party in the first Instance, who does not interpose his Appeal, and at the fame Time give his Claim. and pray the usual Inhibition within One Year, shalk not; after such Year hath elapsed, be intitled to any Appeal.

And it is further ordered, that upon all Sentences or Interlocutory Decrees already given or pronounced, where Appeals, or Protocols of Appeal, have been or fhall be made or entered by any Party in the Caufe, fuch Party fhall profecute the Appeal, by taking out the ufual Inhibition within Three Months from the Date of this Order, if fuch Sentence or Decree fhall be given or pronounced in the High Coart of Admiralty, and within Nine Months, if fuch Sentence or Decree fhall pe given or pronounced in any Vice-Admiralty Court, otherwife fuch Appeal fhall not be allowed to be profecuted, or any Inhibi ion granted; and that upon all Sentences or Interlocutory Decrees already given or pronounced, any Perion not being a Party in the first Inflance, who does not interpofe his Appeal, and at the fame Time give his Claim, and pray the ufual Inhibition, within One Year from the Date of this Order, fhall not be intitled to any Appeal.

Provided neverthelefs, that in all Cafes where a Sentence or Decree hath been given or pronounced above the Space of One Year before the Date of this Order, and the ufual Inhibition hath not been obtained within One Year after fuch Sentence or Decree given or pronounced, that no Appeal fhall be profecuted by, or Inhibition granted to, any Party in the faid Caufe, nor any Appeal entered or Inhibition granted at the Inflance of any Perfon not being Party to the faid Caufe, without the Order of the Lords Commificeners of Appeals first obtained in that Behalf, upon Notice previoufly given to the Parties, appellate; their Profors or Agents, any Thing herein contained to the contrary notwithftanding.

THERFAS His Majefty was gracioufly pleafed, by Kis Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 25th Day of October, 1776, to promise and declare, That the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who fhould, on or before the 31ft of December then following, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as should be employed for raising Men for the Service of the Royal Navy : And whereas His Majefty was also pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 8th Day of November, 1776, to promise and declare, That a Re-ward of Two Pounds for every Able, and Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to any Perfon who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might fecrete themfelves, that fo fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's faid Service, by any of His Majesty's Sea-Officers employed for railing Men, on or before the 31st Day of De-cember, 1776: And whereas His Majetty was like-wife pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 15th Day of August, 1777, to promife and declare, That every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who fhould voluntarily enter himfelf to ferve on Board any of His Majefty's Ships, on or before the 31st Day of October then next, should receive, as of His Majesty's Royal Bounty, the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, to be paid in Manner thereby directed : And whereas Time limited by the faid Proclamations, for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards, hath been prolonged and extended to the 31ft Day of this inftant December; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the faid Bounties and Rewards should be continued to be paid for some Time longer, His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy-Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards be prolonged and extended from the faid 31ft Day of this in-fant December to the 31ft Day of March next, inclusive.——Whereof all Persons concerned are to inclusive .take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly

Dantzig, December 5. The Polish Commissary has received a Letter from Warfaw, dated the 15th paft, by which it appears, that the Epidemical Dif-temper in the Province of Wolhynia and the Ukraine was of a lefs alarming Nature than it was at first apprehended to be; that it is chiefly confined to the Villages of Porrochnia and Wolofzcyk : Thefe Villages are fo well guarded as to prevent Com. munication with the neighbouring Country.
