The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS, by an Act of Parliament passed in the Twenty sixth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to oblige Ships more effectually to perform their Quarantine; and for the better preventing the Plague being brought from Foreign Parts into Great Britain or Ireland, or the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man;" it is, among many other Things, enacted, That all Ships and Vessels arriving, and all Persons, Goods, and Merchandizes whatsoever, coming or imported into any Port or Place within Great Britain or Ireland, or any of the Isles aforementioned, from any Place from whence His Majesty, His Heirs or Successors, by and with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council, shall judge it probable that the Infection may be brought, shall be obliged to make their Quarantine in such Place and Places, for such Time and in such Manner as has been, or shall from Time to Time be, directed by His Majesty, His Heirs or Successors, by His or Their Order or Orders, made in His or Their Privy Council, and notified by Proclamation, or published in the London Gazette; and that until such Ships, Vessels, Persons, Goods and Merchandizes shall have respectively performed and be discharged from such Quarantine, no such Person, Goods, or Merchandizes, or any of them, shall come or be brought on Shore, or go or be put on Board any other Ship or Vessel, in any Place within His Majesty's Dominions, unless in such Manner and in such Cases, and by such Licence, as shall be directed or permitted by such Order or Orders made by His Majesty, His Heirs or Successors, in Council as aforesaid; and that all such Ships and Vessels, and the Persons or Goods coming or imported in, or going or being put on Board the same; and all Ships, Vessels, Boats and Persons receiving any Goods or Persons out of the same, shall be subject to such Orders, Rules and Directions concerning Quarantine, and the Prevention of Infection, as have been or shall be made by His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, in Council, and notified by Proclamation, or published in the London Gazette as aforementioned, under such Pains and Penalties as are inflicted by the said Act. And whereas Information hath been received that the Plague hath manifested itself in many Places of the Ukraine and Wolhynia, and that the Contagion thereof spreads further every Day; and His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth thereupon judge it probable, that the Infection may be brought into this Kingdom from

Danzick, or some Port or Place in Royal and Ducal Prussia or Pomerania, or from some Port or Place in Courland, Samogitia, or Livonia; His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, that all Ships, Vessels, Persons, Goods and Merchandizes, now arrived, or that shall hereafter arrive, in any Port of this Kingdom, or the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark or Man, from Dantzick, or any other Port or Place in Royal and Ducal Prussia or Pomerania, or from any Port or Place in Courland, Samogitia, or Livonia, do make their Quarantine for Forty Days, which is to commence and be computed from the Day each Ship or Vessel shall come to Anchor in the Place appointed for performing Quarantine, and not before.

That the Places herein after named shall be and are hereby appointed to be the Places, wherein such Ships or Vessels (not having the Infection on Board) shall respectively perform Quarantine; that is to say, All such Ships or Vessels which are or shall be bound to the Port of London, or any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, or to the River Thames, or Medway, shall perform their Quarantine in Standgate Creek. All such Ships or Vessels which are or shall be bound to the Ports of Ipswich, Yarmouth, Lynn, Boston, Hull, Newcastle, or Berwick upon Tweed, or any of them, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, shall perform their Quarantine in Whitebooth Road between Hull and Grimsby. All such Ships or Vessels which are or shall be bound to the Ports of Carlisle and Chester, or either of them, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, or to any Part of the Isle of Man, shall perform their Quarantine in a Place called Highlake, near Liverpool, at the West End thereof. All such Ships or Vessels which are or shall be bound to the Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucester, Bristol, Bridgwater, or any of them, or any Member or Creek of them, or any of them, or to Padstow or St. Ives, being Members of the Port of Plymouth, or to Ilfracomb or Barnstaple, being Members of the Port of Exeter, or to any other Place within the said Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucester, Bristol, or Bridgwater, or within the said Members or Creeks, shall perform their Quarantine in Kingroad and Porshute Pill. All such Ships or Vessels which are or shall be bound to the Port of Plymouth, except such Parts thereof as have been herein before mentioned, and also except Falmouth, one Member thereof, or to the Port of Exeter, except such Parts thereof as have been herein before mentioned, or to the Port of Pool, or any of the Members or Creeks, or other Places within the said Ports of Plymouth, Exeter, and Pool, except as before excepted, shall perform their Quarantine in some Place between Woodend and Saltaire.

Saltaſh in the River Tamer: All ſuch Ships or Veffels as are or ſhall be bound to Falmouth, a Member of the Port of Plymouth, or any Creek thereof, or any other Place therein, ſhall perform their Quarantine in a Place called St. Ives Pool, within the Mouth of the Harbour of Falmouth. And all ſuch Ships or Veffels as are or ſhall be bound to the Ports of Southampton, Chicheſter, Sandwich, or any of them, or any of the Members or Creeks thereof, or of any of them, or any other Place within the ſame, ſhall perform their Quarantine at a Place called the Mother Bank near Portſmouth. And all ſuch Ships or Veffels as are or ſhall be bound to the Eaſtern Coaſt of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Leith, Borrowſtoneſs, Alloa, Dunbar, Kirkaldy, Anſtruther, Preſton Pans, Dundee, Perth, Montroſe, and Aberdeen, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, ſhall perform their Quarantine in Inverkeithing Bay. And all ſuch Ships and Veffels as are or ſhall be bound to the Weſtern Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Port Glasgow, Greenock, Irvine, Campbeltoun, Oban, Rothſay, Fort William, Air, Port Patrick, Stranraer, and Wigtown, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, ſhall perform their Quarantine at Lamlaſh in the Iſland of Arran. And all ſuch Ships or Veffels as are or ſhall be bound to the Northern Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Inverneſs, Zetland, Orkney, Caithneſs, and Stornaway, or to any Member, Creek or other Parts thereof, ſhall perform their Quarantine in Cromarty Bay in the Murray Frith. And all ſuch Ships or Veffels as are or ſhall be bound to the South-weſt Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Dumfries and Kirkcudbright, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, ſhall perform their Quarantine at Carſthorn at the Mouth of the River Nith. And all ſuch Ships or Veffels which are or ſhall be bound to the Iſle of Jerſey, or any Part thereof, ſhall perform their Quarantine at a certain Place on the Coaſt of the ſaid Iſland called Belle Crouie, or at ſome Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coaſt of England. And all ſuch Ships or Veffels as ſhall be bound to the Iſlands of Guernſey, Sark or Alderney, or either of them, or any Part of them, or any of them, ſhall perform their Quarantine in a Place near the Iſland of Guernſey, called the Little Road, or at ſome Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coaſt of England.

That no Pilot ſhall go on Board any Ship or Veffel obliged to perform Quarantine, in order to conduct the ſame into any Port or Place, but ſhall perform ſuch Service in ſome other Boat or Veffel, which Boat or Veffel ſhall keep as much to the Windward of the Ship or Veffel, ſo to be conducted, as poſſible; and if any Pilot or other Perſon ſhall go on Board ſuch Ship or Veffel, ſuch Pilot or other Perſon ſhall perform Quarantine, in like Manner as any Perſon coming in ſuch Ship or Veffel ſhall be obliged to perform the ſame.

That all Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes, liable to Quarantine as aforeſaid, ſhall be opened, unpacked, and aired, unleſs His Maſteſty ſhall think fit, by His Order in Council, to direct otherwiſe, and ſo remain a Week; other than Hemp and Flax, Paper or Books, Silk Raw, Thrown, or Wrought, Linnen, Cotton Wool, Cotton Yarn or manufactured, Wool Raw or any wiſe Wrought, Feathers, Grograin or Mohair Yarn, Human Hair, Goats Hair, Carmentia Wool, Carpets, Camblets, Burdets, or other Manufactures of Silk and Cotton, Kid Skins, and Skins in the Wool or Hair, Spunges, Wine and Oil

in Cheſts, Thread Stockings, all Goods packed with Straw or Cotton, Straw Hats, and Bruſhes, Matting, and Artificial Flowers; which Goods and Merchandizes, ſo as aforeſaid enumerated, are to be opened, unpacked, and aired, unleſs His Maſteſty ſhall think fit, by His Order in Council, to direct otherwiſe, and ſo remain for the Space of a Fortnight.

That all Goods imported by ſuch Ships and Veffels reſpectively ſhall be aired in the following Places, that is to ſay: All ſuch Goods as ſhall be imported to the Port of London, or any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, or to the River Thames, or Medway, ſhall be aired in Standgate Creek. All ſuch Goods as ſhall be imported to the Ports of Ipſwich, Yarmouth, Lynn, Boſton, Hull, Newcastle, or Berwick upon Tweed, or any of them, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, ſhall be aired in Whitebooth Road, between Hull and Grimsby. All ſuch Goods as ſhall be imported to the Ports of Carlile and Cheſter, or either of them, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, or to any Part of the Iſle of Man, ſhall be aired in a Place called Highlake, near Liverpool, at the Weſt End thereof. All ſuch Goods as ſhall be imported to the Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Glouceſter, Briſtol, Bridgwater, or any of them, or any Member or Creek of them, or any of them, or to Padſlow or St. Ives, being Members of the Port of Plymouth, or to Ilfracomb or Barnſtable, being Members of the Port of Exeter, or to any other Place within the ſaid Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Glouceſter, Briſtol, or Bridgwater, or within the ſaid Members or Creeks, ſhall be aired in Kingroad, and Porſhute Pill. All ſuch Goods as ſhall be imported to the Port of Plymouth, except ſuch Parts thereof as have been herein before mentioned, and alſo except Falmouth, one Member thereof, or to the Port of Exeter, except ſuch Parts thereof as have been herein before mentioned, or to the Port of Pool, or any of the Members or Creeks, or other Places within the ſaid Ports of Plymouth, Exeter and Pool, except as before excepted, ſhall be aired in ſome Place between Wood-end and Saltaſh in the River Tamer. All ſuch Goods as ſhall be imported to Falmouth, a Member of the Port of Plymouth, or any Creek thereof, or any other Place therein, ſhall be aired in a Place called St. Ives Pool, within the Mouth of the Harbour of Falmouth. All ſuch Goods as ſhall be imported to the Ports of Southampton, Chicheſter, Sandwich, or any of them, or any of the Members or Creeks thereof, or of any of them, or any other Place within the ſame, ſhall be aired at a Place called the Mother Bank near Portſmouth. And all ſuch Goods as ſhall be imported to the Eaſtern Coaſt of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Leith, Borrowſtoneſs, Alloa, Dunbar, Kirkaldy, Anſtruther, Preſton Pans, Dundee, Perth, Montroſe, and Aberdeen, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, ſhall be aired in Inverkeithing Bay. And all ſuch Goods as ſhall be imported to the Weſtern Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Port Glasgow, Greenock, Irvine, Campbeltoun, Oban, Rothſay, Fort William, Air, Port Patrick, Stranraer, and Wigtown, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, ſhall be aired at Lamlaſh in the Iſland of Arran. And all ſuch Goods as ſhall be imported to the Northern Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Inverneſs, Zetland, Orkney, Caithneſs, and Stornaway, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, ſhall be aired in Cromarty Bay in the Murray Frith. And all ſuch Goods as ſhall be imported to the South-weſt Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Dumfries and Kirkcudbright,

Kirkcudbright, or to any Member, Creek or other Parts thereof, shall be aired at Carsthorpe, at the Mouth of the River Nith. And all such Goods as shall be imported to the Isle of Jersey, or any Part thereof, shall be aired at a certain Place on the Coast of the said Island called Belle Croute, or at such Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coast of England, where the Ships, in which such Goods are imported, shall respectively perform their Quarantine. And all such Goods as shall be imported to the Islands of Guernsey, Sark, or Alderney, or either of them, or any Part of them, or any of them, shall be aired in a Place near the Island of Guernsey, called the Little Road, or at such Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coast of England, where the Ships, in which such Goods are imported, shall respectively perform their Quarantine. That whatsoever Ship or Person shall receive any Men or Goods from on Board any Ship or Vessel under Quarantine, shall be compelled to perform the like Quarantine. That such Persons as, after Quarantine performed, shall be employed in the Hold of any Ship or Vessel, for the taking any Goods not liable to retain Infection from the Goods and Merchandizes before enumerated, shall be obliged to perform a new Quarantine. That the Captains of every of His Majesty's Ships of War, who shall meet any such Ship or Vessel coming to any of the Ports of Great Britain or Ireland, or of the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man, shall take due Care to prevent the Landing any Goods, Seamen or Passengers from on Board the same, until they shall be put under the Direction of the Officers of His Majesty's Customs.

That the Commissioners and other Officers of His Majesty's Customs do use their utmost Diligence and Care, that the Quarantine before directed be duly performed.

That the Commanders of His Majesty's Ships of War, as likewise the Commanders of His Majesty's Ports and Garrisons lying near the Sea Coasts, and all the Justices of the Peace, Mayors, Sheriffs, Bailiffs, Chief Magistrates, Constables, Headboroughs, Tything Men, and all other Officers and Ministers of Justice, be aiding and assisting to the said Officers of His Majesty's Customs, and to all others that shall be concerned in stopping all such Ships as aforesaid, and in bringing them to their Places appointed for the Performance of their Quarantine, and in due Performance thereof.

And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the said respective Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it has been represented unto His Majesty, that great Inconveniences have arisen, by Appeals in Prize Causes not being prosecuted in a reasonable Time, and from Secret Appeals, or Protocols of Appeals, being entered before a Notary Publick, without any Notice given to the Court or Parties appellate, or their Proctors: For Remedy whereof, His Majesty hath thought fit, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order and direct, that every Person being a Party in a Prize Cause in the High Court of Admiralty of England, or in any Vice-Admiralty Court, and against whom a Sentence shall hereafter be given, or an Interlocutory Decree pronounced, and who shall appeal therefrom within Fourteen Days, shall prosecute such his Appeal, by taking out the usual Inhibition within Three Months after the Time such Sentence or Interlocutory Decree shall be given, if such Sentence or Decree shall be given in the High Court of Admiralty, and within Nine Months, if such Sentence or Decree shall be given in any of the Vice-Admiralty Courts; and that after the Expiration of the said Terms of Three Months and Nine Months respectively limited as aforesaid, without any Inhibition having been taken out, no Appeal shall be allowed to be prosecuted by any Person being a Party in the said High Court of Admiralty, or Vice-Admiralty Courts, nor shall any Inhibition be granted at the Prayer of such Person, or his Proctor, but the said Sentence or Interlocutory Decree shall stand confirmed as to such Person. And that in all Cases where a Sentence shall be given, or Interlocutory Decree shall be pronounced in the High Court of Admiralty, or in any of His Majesty's Vice-Admiralty Courts, any Person not being a Party in the first Instance, who does not interpose his Appeal, and at the same Time give his Claim, and pray the usual Inhibition within One Year, shall not, after such Year hath elapsed, be intitled to any Appeal.

And it is further ordered, that upon all Sentences or Interlocutory Decrees already given or pronounced, where Appeals, or Protocols of Appeal, have been or shall be made or entered by any Party in the Cause, such Party shall prosecute the Appeal, by taking out the usual Inhibition within Three Months from the Date of this Order, if such Sentence or Decree shall be given or pronounced in the High Court of Admiralty, and within Nine Months, if such Sentence or Decree shall be given or pronounced in any Vice-Admiralty Court, otherwise such Appeal shall not be allowed to be prosecuted, or any Inhibition granted; and that upon all Sentences or Interlocutory Decrees already given or pronounced, any Person not being a Party in the first Instance, who does not interpose his Appeal, and at the same Time give his Claim, and pray the usual Inhibition, within One Year from the Date of this Order, shall not be intitled to any Appeal.

Provided nevertheless, that in all Cases where a Sentence or Decree hath been given or pronounced above the Space of One Year before the Date of this Order, and the usual Inhibition hath not been obtained within One Year after such Sentence or Decree given or pronounced, that no Appeal shall be prosecuted by, or Inhibition granted to, any Party in the said Cause, nor any Appeal entered or Inhibition granted at the Instance of any Person not being Party to the said Cause, without the Order of the Lords Commissioners of Appeals first obtained in that Behalf, upon Notice previously given to the Parties appellate, their Proctors or Agents, any Thing herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

WHEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 25th Day of October, 1776, to promise and declare, That the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to every such Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who should, on or before the 31st of December then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board such Tenders as should be employed for raising Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majesty was also pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 8th Day of November, 1776, to promise and declare, That a Reward of Two Pounds for every Able, and Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might secrete themselves, that so such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's said Service, by any of His Majesty's Sea-Officers employed for raising Men, on or before the 31st Day of December, 1776: And whereas His Majesty was likewise pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 15th Day of August, 1777, to promise and declare, That every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should voluntarily enter himself to serve on Board any of His Majesty's Ships, on or before the 31st Day of October then next, should receive, as of His Majesty's Royal Bounty, the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, to be paid in Manner thereby directed: And whereas the Time limited by the said Proclamations, for Payment of the said Bounties and Rewards, hath been prolonged and extended to the 31st Day of this instant December; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the said Bounties and Rewards should be continued to be paid for some Time longer, His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy-Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the said Bounties and Rewards be prolonged and extended from the said 31st Day of this instant December to the 31st Day of March next, inclusive.—Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

Dantzic, December 5. The Polish Commissary has received a Letter from Warsaw, dated the 15th past, by which it appears, that the Epidemical Distemper in the Province of Wolhynia and the Ukraine was of a less alarming Nature than it was at first apprehended to be; that it is chiefly confined to the Villages of Porrochnia and Wolofzyk: These Villages are so well guarded as to prevent Communication with the neighbouring Country.
