**T**HE Burgomasters and Senators of the City of Emden do hereby make known to all Sea-faring Men, that, for greater Security of the Navigation on and about the Eastfriesland-Coast, and the better to make the River Ems in the Night-time, they, at the Ex-ence of the City, have erected a Light-house on the Island of Borkum, on which a Coal Fire will commence to be lighted on the 15th of December, 1780, and which will be kept up every Night, from Sun-set to Sun-rise.

This Light-house is placed at Borkum, between the Steeple and the great Beacon there, almost in the same Line, and is Half a Point further to the East on one of the Lower Downs, 38 Feet above its Foundation, and from the Lowness of the Surface of the Island will be about 50 Feet high.

Coming from Sea to enter the Easter Ems, you bring the great Beacon of Borkum into the Steeple to find the Out Buoy. When

When you are by it, you have the Steeple at South, and the new-erected Light-house South and South by East.

The above-mentioned first Black Buoy lies at Five Fathoms at Low Water on the West Shore of the Borkum Riff; from thence you let your Course to the Dumpei Buoy; South East by East; but first you have a White Flag Buoy on the Larboard Side, which lies at Four Fathoms at Low Water. The Middle of the Channel is Five, Six, to Seven Fathoms deep at Low Water, and wide enough to sail in.

To support the Expenses of this Light-house, every inward-bound Vessel, either loaded or in Ballast, (besides the usual Tonnage payable by every Foreign Vessel, at the Rate of Five Stivers for every Last Rye Measure) is to pay at Light Dues One Dutch Stiver, or One Stiver and an Half Eastfriesland Money, for every Rye Last of the Ship's Burthen; but the outward-bound Vessels only when they are loaded.

Besides the Cargo pays Four Stivers for every Hundred Guilders, or One Fifth per Cent. of its Value.

All Vessels which put into the Bms through Necessity, or pass over the Flats, and don't touch on Eastfriesland Harbour or Island, are to pay the said Tonnage and Light Dues to the Lightmen at Borkum, or the City Buoyman. Which all and every Seafaring Men are to be regulated by.
