**T**HE King has been pleased to present the Rev. Mr. Hugh M'Diarmot to the Church and Parish of Comrie, in the Presbitery of Auchterader and Shire of Perth, vacant by the Death of Mr. Robert Menzies.

**W**hereas it has been humbly represented to the King, That on Sunday the 14th of January instant, about One o'Clock in the Morning, the Dwelling-house of Francis Evered, of Great Saxham in the County of Suffolk, Farmer, was attempted to be broken open by Four Persons armed, supposed to be Smugglers, who with horrid Imprecations threatened to murder every one in the House; and actually fired Two Pistols loaded with Balls and Slugs, one of which narrowly missed the said Francis Evered, the other wounded his Daughter in several Places; but the Neighbourhood being alarmed, the Ruffians were prevented from any farther Violence.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the Outrages above-mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person or Persons who actually discharged the said Pistols) who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And as a farther Encouragement, the said Francis Evered doth hereby promise a Reward of TWENTY POUNDS, and the Parish of Great Saxham aforesaid do also promise an additional Reward of TWENTY POUNDS, to any Person making such Discovery as above-mentioned (except as before excepted) to be paid upon the Conviction of any one or more of the said Offenders.

N. B. One of the Men concerned in the aforesaid Attempt was dressed in a Blue Coat; and the others in light-coloured Coats, with Boots on.
