HEREAS, upon the Commencement of Hostilities against the States Ge-neral of the United Provinces, His

Majesty thought fit, by His Order in Council of the zzd of December last, to declare His Royal Intention to allow all Ships belonging to the Subjects of the States General, then in any of His Majesty's Ports, to depart with their Cargoes, (except fuch Part thereof as shall consist of Salted Provisions of any Kind, or of Naval or Warlike Stores) and to grant Paffes for the faid Ships and Cargoes, except as before excepted, to protect them from Capture by any Ships of His Majesty, or His Subjects, in their Return to fome Port of the United Provinces: But inasmuch as His Majesty was intitled to expect and demand the Tame Treatment from the States General of the United Provinces, for the Ships and Cargoes belonging to any of His Majefty's Subjects, His Majefty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, was pleafed to order, and it was thereby ordered, that all Ships and Merchandize belong-ing to the States General of the United Provinces, or their Subjects, then in any Port of His Ma-jefly's Dominions, fhould remain and be detained fecure and unmolelled within the fame, until it fhould appear that the States General of the United Provinces were disposed and intended to proceed upon the fame Ideas of good Faith with refpect to the Ships and Cargoes of any of His Majefty's Subjects remaining in any Port belonging to the States General of the United Provinces. And whereas His Majefly's has received certain Advice, that the States General of the United Provinces have declared and concluded, by their Placart dated at the Hague the 26th of January laft, that, as foon as the Dutch Ships shall be permitted to depart from England, the English Ships shall be no longer detained in their Ports, but immediately be permitted to depart, and be provided with Paffports as therein mentioned; His Majefty, taking the fame into His Royal Confideration, hath therefore ordered, as it is hereby ordered in Council, That all Ships and Veffels belonging to the Subjects of the States General of the United Provinces, together with the Perfons and Cargoes on Board them, (other than and except Salted Provisions of any Kind, or Naval or Warlike Stores) which are now detained, by Virtue of the afore-mentioned Order in Council of the 22d of December last, in the Ports of Great Britain, Ireland, or other Ports of His Majesty's Dominions, or which had been feized and brought into any of the faid Ports by any of the Ships of His Majefty or His Subjects. before the Order for General Re-

7 HEREAS upon Information received that the Plague had manifested itself in many Places of the Ukraine and Wolhynia, His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 15th of December last, to direct, that all Ships then arrived or that fhould thereafter arrive from Dantzick, or any other Port or Place in Royal or Ducal Prussia or Pomerania, or from any Port or Place in Courland, Samogitia, or Livonia, fhould make their Quarantine for Forty Days: And whereas there was this Day read at the Board feveral Advices that have been lately received from His Majesty's Conful at Dantzick, whereby it appears, that the Phylicians and Surgeons employed in examining into the real Nature of the Diftemper have declared, that the fame was no ways the Plague, as it had been reprefented, but a Malig-nant Fever, eafily cured by proper Medicines; and it having been further reprefented, that in confequence of proper Meafures taken, the faid Calamity hath now entirely fubfided:—His Ma-jefty taking the fame into Confideration, and being defirous to remove all Restraints upon Trade, to far as may be confistent with the Safety of His Subjects, is pleafed, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the Quarantine at prefent fublifting upon Ships and Veffels coming from Dantzick, or any other Port or Place in Royal or Ducal Prufia or Pomerania, or from any Port or Place in Courland, Samogitia, or Livonia, be taken off; and that all Ships and Vessels already arrived, or that may hereafter arrive from those Places, be permitted to difcharge their refpective Ladings, without un-packing, opening and airing, and without per-forming any Quarantine; provided they fhall have the faid Ports by any of the Ships of His Majefty or His Subjects. before the Order for General Re-prizals against the States was issued, and have been already declared, or shall hereafter be declared, rections contained in His Majesty's Order in Coun-
