HIS Day, the Lords being met, a Meffage was fent to the Honourable Houle of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Knight, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that the Lords, authorized by Wirtue of His Majefty's Commission, for declaring His Royal Affent to feweral Asts agreed upon by both Houfes, do defire the immediate Attendance of thit Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commission, impowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great. Britain, the Lord President of the Council, and feveral other Lords therein mentioned, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the faid Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Affent given to

An Act for punifying Mutiny and Defertion, and for the better Payment of the Army and their Quar-Ler's

An Act for the Regulation of His Majefly's Marine Forces while on Shore.

An Act for the better Supply of Mariners and Seamen, to ferve in His Majefty's Ships of War, and on Board Merchant Ship:, and other Trading Ships and Neffels.

An AEI for making Compensation to the Proprietors of certain Messinges, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, in the Counties of Kent and Effex, purchased in Pursuance of Iwo several Acts of Pasliament, passed in the Twentieth Year of the Reign of His prejent Majefly, for fecuring His Majefly's Docks, Ships, and Stores at Sheernefs and Chatham, and for bester defending the Paffuge of the River Thames at Grave-fend and Tilbury Fort.

An Act to explain and amend an Act, made in the Nineteenth Year of His prejent Majesty's Reign, inti-
