Westminster, March 22. HIS Day His Majesty came to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes feated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Sir Francis Molyneux, Knight, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, was fent with a Message from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Assent to

An Act for raifing a certain Sum, by Way of Annuities and a Lottery; and for confolidating certain Annuities, which were made One Joint Stock by an Ast made in the Second Year of the Reign of His pre-Sent Majesty, with certain Annuities consolidated by se-

jent Majesty, with certain Annuities confolidated by se-weral AAs made in the Twenty-fifth and Twenty-fixth Years of the Reign of King George the Second, and in the Fifth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty. An AA for defraying the Charge of the Pay and Cloathing of the Militia in that Part of Great Britain called England, for One Year, beginning the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand seven hundred and

An Ast for appointing Commissioners for putting in Execution an Ast of this Session of Parliament, intituled, " An Act for granting an Aid to His Majesty by " a Land Tax, to be raised in Great Britain, for the Service of the Year One thousand seven hundred and eighty-one."

An Ast for the Encouragement of Seamen, and for the more speedy and effectual Manning His Majesty's

Nawy.

An Ast for rendering effectual an Ast, made in the Eighteenth Year of His present Majesty, for the better Relief and Employment of the Poor within the Hundred of Stown in the Country of Suffolk.

An Att for enlarging the Term and Powers of an Att, passed in the Second Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, instituted, "An Att for amending, widening, and keeping in Repair, several Roads there-" in mentioned, lying in the Counties of Leicester and Warwick, and in the County of the City of Coven-

An Ast for enlarging the Term and Powers of so much of an As, made in the Thirty third Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, as relates to repairing and widening the Roads from Deanburn Bridge, through Greenlaw, and Part of the Jed-burgh Road, by Lauder, in the Shire of Berwick, 10 Cornhill, in the County of Durham.

An Ast for repairing and widening the Read from a certain Gate on the Turnpike Road at or near the South End of the Town of Weston on the Green in the County of Oxford, to the Turnpike Read on Kidling-

ton Green in the faid County.

An All for continuing the Term, and altering and enlarging the Powers of an All, made in the Thirtythird Year of His late Majessy, for amending, widen-ing, and keeping in the Counties of Derby, Leicester, and Warwick; and for amending, and keeping in Repair, the Road branching from Part of the Jaid Roads, between Meashum in the said County of Derby and Bur-eon upon Trent in the County of Sinsford, to the Turn-pike Road at or near The Bull's Head Alebouse in Twycross, in the said County of Leicester.

An Ast to enlarge the Term and Powers of an Ast, made in the First Year of the Reign of His present Ma-

jesty, for repairing and widening the Road leading from the Eastern End of the Bosough of Grampound in the County of Cornwall, through the Towns of St. Austell and Lost withiel, and from thence to the East End of the Western Taphouse Lane, in the faid County.

## GEORGE R.

INSTRUCTIONS for the Commanders of fuch Merchant Ships or Vessels who shall (L. S.) have Letters of Marque and Reprizals for private Men of War against the States-General of the United Provinces, or their Subissts or other inhabitions Subjects, or others inhabiting within any of the Territories of the afterfaid States-General, by Virtue of Our Commission granted under Our Great Seal of Great Britain, bearing Date the Twentieth Day of this instant December. Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Twenty-first Day of December, 1780, in the Twenty first Year of Our Reign.

Article I.

HAT it shall be lawful for the Commanders of Ships authorized by Letters of Marque and Reprizal for private Men of War, to set upon by Force of Arms, and subdue and take, the Men of War, Ships and Vessels, Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes of the States General of the United Provinces, and their Subjects, and others inhabiting within any of the Territories of the aforesaid States-General; but so as that no Hostility be committed, nor Prize attacked, seized or taken, within the Harbours of Princes and States in Amity with Us, or in their Rivers or Roads, within the Shot of their Cannon, unless by Permission of such Princes or States, or of their Commanders or Go-vernors in Chief in such Places.

Article II. That the Commanders of Ships and

Vessels, so authorized as asoresaid, shall bring all Ships, Vessels, and Goods, which they shall seize and take, into such Port of this Our Realm of England, or fome other Port of Our Dominions not in Rebellion, as shall be most convenient for them, in order to have the same legally adjudged in Our High Court of Admiralty of England, or before the Judges of any other Admiralty Court lawfully

authorized within Our Dominions.

Article III. That after such Ships, Vessels, and Goods, shall be taken and brought into any Port, the Taker, or one of his chief Officers, or some other Person present at the Capture, shall be obliged to bring or fend, as foon as possibly may be, three or four of the Principal of the Company (whereof the Master, Mate, or Boatswain, to be always two) of every Ship or Vessel so brought into Port, before the Judge of Our High Court of Admiralty of England, or his Surrogate, or before the Judge of fuch other Admiralty Court within Our Dominions, lawfully authorized as aforefaid, or fuch as shall be lawfully commissioned in that Behalf, to be sworn and examined upon such Interrogatories as shall tend to the Discovery of the Truth concerning the Interest or Property of such Ship or Ships, Vessel or Vessels, and of the Goods, Merchandizes or other Effects found therein; and the Taker shall be farther obliged, at the Time he produceth the Company to be examined, and before any Monition shall be issued, to bring and deli-
