liver into the Hands of the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty of England, his Surrogate, or the Judge of fuch other Admiralty-Court within Our Dominions lawfully authorized, or others commiflioned as aforefaid, all fuch Papers, Paffes, Sea-Briefs, Charter-Parties, Bills of Lading, Cockets, Letters, and other Documents and Writings, as fhall be delivered up, or found on board any Ship. The Taker, or one of his chief Officers, or fome other Perfon who was prefent at the Capture, and faw the faid Papers and Writings delivered up, or otherwife found on board at the Time of the Capture, making Oath that the faid Papers and Writings are brought and delivered in as they were received and taken, without any Fraud, Addition, Subduction or Embezzlement, or otherwife to account for the fame upon Oath, to the Satisfaction of the Court.

Article IV. That the Ships, Veffels, Goods, Wares, Merchandizes, and Effects, taken by Virtue of Letters of Marque and Reprizals as aforefaid, fhall be kept and preferved, and no Part of them fhall be fold, fpoiled, walted, or diminifhed; and that the Bulk thereof fhall not be broken before Judgment be given in the High Court of Admiralty of England, or fome other Court of Admiralty lawfully authorized in that Behalf, that the Ships, Goods, and Merchandizes are lawful Prize.

Article V. That if any Ship or Veffel belonging to Us, or Our Subjects, shall be found in Distress, by being in Fight, set upon, or taken by the Enemy, or by Reason of any other Accident, the Commanders, Officers, and Company of such Merchaut Ships or Veffels as shall have Letters of Marque and Reprizals as aforesaid, shall use their bet Endeavours, and give Aid and Succour to all such ship and Ships, and shall, to the utmost of their Power, labour to free the same from the Enemy, or any other Distress.

Article VI. That the Commanders or Owners of fuch Ships and Veffels, before the taking out Letters of Marque and Reprizals, shall make Application in Writing, subscribed with their Hands, to Our High Admiral of Great-Britain, or Our Commillioners for executing that Office for the Time being, or the Lieutenant or Judge of the faid High Court of Admiralty, or his Surrogate, and shall therein fet forth a particular, true, and exact De-forigition of the Ship or Veffel for which fuch Letter of Marque and Reprizal is requefted, specifying the Burthen of fuch Ship or Veffel, and the Number and Nature of the Guns, and what other warlike Furniture and Ammunition are on board the fame, to what Place the Ship belongs, and the Name or Names of the principal Owner or Owners of fuch Ship and Veffel, and the Number of Men intended to be put on board the fame, and for what Time they are visualled, also the Names of the Commander and Officers.

Article VII. That the Commanders of Ships and Veffels having Letters of Marque and Reprizals as aforefaid, shall hold and keep, and are hereby enjoined to hold and keep a Correspondence, by all Conveniences and upon all Occafions, with Our High Admiral of Great Britain, or Our Commiffioners for executing that Office for the Time being, or their Secretary; fo as from Time to Time to render and give him or them not gnly an Account or Intelligence of their Captures and Proceedings by Virtue of fuch Commissions, but also of whatfoever elle shall occur unto them, or be discovered and declared to them, or found out by them, or by Examination of, or Conference with, any Mariners or Passengers of or in the Ships or Vessels taken, or by any other Ways and Means whatsoever, touching or concerning the Defigns of the Enemy, or any of their Fleets, Ships, Veffels or Parties; and of the Stations, Sea-Ports, and Places, and of their Intents therein ; and of what Ships or Veffels of the Enemy bound out or home, or where cruizing, as they shall hear of; and of what elfe material in these Cases may arrive at their Knowledge; to the end such Course may be thereupon taken, and fuch Orders given, as may be requifite.

Article VIII. That no Commander of any Ship of Veffel having a Letter of Marque and Reprizal as aforefaid, fhall prefume, as they will answer-it at their Peril, to wear any Jack, Pennant, or other Enfign, or Colours usfully borne by Our Ships; but that, besides the Colours usfully borne by Merchant Ships, they do wear a Red Jack, with the Union Jack deferibed in the Canton at the Upper Corner thereof, near the Staff.

Corner thereof, near the Staff. Article 1X. That no Commander of any Ship or Veffel having a Letter of Marque and Reprizal as aforefaid, fhall ranfom or agree to ranfom, or quit, or fet at Liberty, any Ship or Veffel, or their Cargoes, which fhall be feized and taken.

Article X. That all Captains or commanding Officers of Ships having Letters of Marque and Reprizals, do fend an Account of, and deliver over, what Prifoners shall be taken on board any Prizes, to the Commissioners appointed or to be appointed for the Exchange of Prifoners of War, or the Persons appointed in the Sea Port Towns to take Charge of Prifoners; and that such Prisoners be subject only to the Orders, Regulations, and Directions of the faid Commissioners; and that no Commander or other Officer of any Ship having a Letter of Marque and Reprizal aforesaid, do presume, upon any Pretence whatsoever, to ransom any Prisoners.

Article XI. Whereas Information has been received, that feveral of the Seamen belonging to Veffels employed in Our Service have been induced to defert from the faid Veffels, and to enter on board Priva-teers, by the Offer of large Bounties and other Advantages held out to them by the Commanders of fuch Privateers; in confequence of which, the faid Veffels have been detained in Port, to the great Detriment and Diftress of our Service : For the avoiding fuch Inconvenience for the future, We-do hereby strictly charge and enjoin all Commanders of Privateers and Merchant Ships, having Letters of Marque, that they do upon no Account receive and detain on board their ships any Seamen belonging to any of Our Ships of War, or any other Veffels employed in Our Service, either as Transports, Store Ships, or Victuallers; and that if they fhould at any Time undefignedly have received any fuch Seaman, they do immediately deliver him up, upon Application made by or on Behalf of the Captain or Commander of fuch Ship of War, or other Ship employed in Our Sérvice, to which he belonged be-fore he entered on board fuch Privateer, or commiffioned Ship, under Pain of Our higheft Difplea-fure, and fuch Penalty as by Law may be inflicted.

Article XII. That no Commander of any Man of War or Privateer do upon any Pretence take any French or Spanish Vessel or Vessels belonging to the United Provinces, or to any other Enemies or re-bellious Subjects of the Crown of Great Britain, out of any Port belonging to the Ottoman Empire, nor moleft, detain, or imprison the Persons of any of the Subjects of the Grand Signor, nor feize or detain as Puize their Ships or Effects, in the Levant Seas, or any other Part of the Ocean, under Pain of Our higheft Displeasure, and such Punishment as by Law may be inflicted; and that the Command-ers of Men of War and Privateers do carry the Subjects of the Ottoman Empire, and their Effects, which they shall find on board French or Spanish Ships, or Ships belonging to the United Provinces, or to any other Enemies or rebellious Subjects of the Crown of Great Britain, feized in the Levant Seas, bound to or from any Port in Egypt, or to or from one Port to another in the Levant Seas, either to the nearest Port in Turkey or Egypt, or to their deftined Port, and there land fuch Perfons and Effects as shall manifestly appear to belong to the Turks; and that no Effects or Merchandize taken on board any French, Spanith, Dutch, or other Enemies or rebellious Subjects Ship, which shall be claimed by any Subjects of the Grand Signor, as being their Property, shall be proceeded against for Condemnation in any other Court but the High Court of Admiralty of England; and that no Pro-ceedings shall be had in the faid High Court of Admiralty against any Goods or Effects which shall appear
