WHEREAS His Majelty was gracioully pleafed, by His Roval Production by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 25th Day of October, 1776, to promife and declare, That the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majelty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who fhould, on or before the 31ft of December then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as should be employed for raifing Men-for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majefty was also pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 8th Day of No-wember, 1776, to promise and declare, That a Re-ward of Two Pounds for every Able, and Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might fecrete themfelves, that fo fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's faid Service, by any of His Majesty's Sea-Officers employed for railing Men, on or before the 31lt Day of De-cember, 1776: And whereas His Majesty was likewife pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 15th Day of August, 1777, to promife and declare, That every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should voluntarily enter himfelf to ferve on Board any of His Majesty's Ships, on or before the 31st Day of October then next, should receive, as of His Majesty's Royal Bounty, the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, to be paid

in Manner thereby directed < And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations, for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards, hath been prolonged and extended to the 31ft Day of this inftant March; and it being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service that the faid Bounties and Rewards should be continued to be paid for fome Time longer, His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy-Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards be prolonged and extended from the faid 31ft Day of this inflant March to the 30th Day of June next, inclufive.——Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.
