Extract of a Letter from Captain Brown, of the Profelyte, to the Hon. Keith Stewart, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships employed on the Leith Station, and by him transmitted to Mr. Stephens, dated Leith, May 3, 1781.

ON Wednesday the 26th ult. Fair Island bearing N. W. distant 10 Leagues, I fell in with the Rouen Soubise, a Ship belonging to the French King, commanded by Pierre Vanitabel, a Lieutenant De Fregate, mounting 22 Nine Pounders, 156 Men, which we took, after chacing 13 Hours; and she is now in this Road.
