**W**HEREAS repeated Informations have been received at this Office, that divers Officers in the Army and Navy, when travelling Post on His Majesty's Service, claim a Right of passing through any Turnpike, without delivering to the Tollgate-keeper there the Stamp-Office Ticket, denoting that His Majesty's Duty on Post-Horses has been paid:

The Commissioners for managing the said Revenue, in order to remove this Error as soon as possible from the Minds of such Gentlemen as may have undesignedly entertained such an Opinion, and that they may not in future meet with any Inconvenience or Delay at the Turnpikes through which they may have Occasion to pass, do hereby give this Public Notice, that, in the Act for laying a Duty on Post-Horses, &c. there is no Exemption for any Person whosoever to go Post free of the said Duty; and therefore the Tollgate-keepers have been peremptorily instructed not to permit any Person, travelling Post as aforesaid, to pass through their respective Gates, without delivering to them the Stamp-

Office Ticket, or paying One Shilling and Sixpence for every Horse hired and used by such Traveller, as the said Act directs.
