HIS Day, the Lords being met, a Mef-fage was fent to the Honourable Houle of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Ufher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by Virtue of His Majefly's Commission, for declaring His

Royal Affent to feweral Acts agreed upon by both Houfes, do defire the immediate Attendance of this Honour-able Houfe in the Houfe of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commission, impowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great-Britain, the Lord President of the Council, and feveral other Lords therein mentioned, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the faid Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Affent given to

An Act for repealing the prefent Duties upon Paper, Pasteboards, Millboards, and Scaleboards, made in Great Britain; and for granting other Duties in Lieu thereof.

An Act for the better Management and Collection of the Duties upon Male Servants, granted by an Act made in the Seventeenth Year of the Reign of His pre-Jent Majefty:

An Act to indemnify fush Perfons as have omitted to qualify themselves for Offices and Employments; and to indemnify Justices of the Peace, or others, who have omitted to register or deliver in their Qualifica-tions within the Time limited by Law, and for giving further Time for those Purposes; and to indemnify Members and Officers in Cities, Corporations, and Borough Towns, whose Admissions have been omitted to be stamped according to Law, or, having been stamped, have been lost or mislaid, and for allowing them Time to provide Admissions duly stamped; and to give further Time to fuch Perfons as have omitted to make and file Affidavits of the Execution of Indentures of Clerks to Attornies and Solicitors.

An Act for allowing further Time for the Exporta-tion of, or Payment of the Duties upon, Bugles when warehoused upon Importation into this Kingdom, and for obviating a Doubt with respect to charging the Duties on Rum imported from Scotland into The Isle of Man

An AE to permit Goods, the Product or Manufacture of certain Places within The Levant or Mediterranean Seas, to be imported into Great Britain or Ireland, in British or Foreign Vessels, from any Place whatsfoever, and for laying a Duty on Cotton and Cot-ton Wool imported into this Kingdom, in Foreign Ships

or Veffels, during the prefent Hoftilities. An Act to permit, during the prefent Hoftilities, the Importation of Goods, the Produce of the Plantations of the Crown of Portugal, into Great Britain or Ire-land, in Portugueze Veffels, and the Importation of

certain other Goods therein enumerated in any Neu-tral Ships and Veffels.

An Act to continue feweral Laws, relating to the opening and establishing certain Free Ports in the Island of Jamaica; to the allowing the free Importation of Sago Powder and Vermicelli from His Majefly's. Colonies in North America; to the free Importation of certain Raw Hides and Skins from Ireland and the British Plantations in America; to the allowing the Exportation of Provisions, Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, to certain Places in North America which are, or may be, under the Protection of His Majefly's Arms, and from fuch Places to Great Britain, and other Parts of His Majefly's Dominions; to the clandeftine Running of Uncuftomed Goods, and prevent ing Frauds velating of Oncustomen Goous, and preventing the clandestine Running of Goods, and the Danger of Infection thereby; to the encouraging the Growth of Coffee in His Majefy's Plantations in America; to the preventing the committing of Frauds by Bankrupts; and to revive and continue several Laws relating to allowing the Exportation of certain Quantities of Wheat and other Articles to His Majesty's Sugar Colonics in Ame-rica; to the impowering His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation, and restrain the carrying Coastivise, of Copper in Bars or Copper in Sheets; to the allowing a Drawback of the Duties on Rum shipped as Stores to be confumed on board Merchant Ships on their Voyages; and to the allowing a Bounty on the Exportation British Corn and Grain in Neutral Ships
